Another testifies in absence of Khaleda

A Dhaka court yesterday recorded statement of one more prosecution witness in Zia Charitable Trust graft case in absence of BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia.

Judge Abu Ahmed Jomadar of the Special Judge Court-3 recorded statement of Mesbahul Haque, a former official of Sonali Bank's Prime Minister Office branch.

Earlier in the day, counsel for Khaleda completed cross-examination of four other prosecution witnesses. A total of 13 prosecution witnesses, including complainant of the case, have so far testified before the makeshift court at Bakshibazar in the capital.

The court fixed November 5 for Khaleda's lawyer Masud Ahmed Talukder to cross-examine the witness. Before that, Masud filed

two petitions, saying the BNP chief went to London for treatment and they wanted to cross-examine the witness on the next scheduled date. He also told the court Khalda would return on November 7. He filed two more petitions over Khaleda's absence.

The BNP chief earlier had postponed the date of her return at least four times. Family and party sources said Khaleda was first scheduled to return home on October 8. Later

## DB still quizzing Work likely to start by Dec

Construction of the National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery is expected to begin by December, aiming to produce skilled healthcare providers, including surgeons, and provide state of the art facilities and proper treatment to around six lakh patients a year.

It would be possible after the project's financing plan is approved on being placed in any of the upcoming meetings of the Executive Committee of the National Economic Council, the institute's National Coordinator Dr Samanta Lal Sen told The Daily Star recently.

Initially each year, it will produce 10 to 12 doctors, who will attain the Master of Science in Plastic Surgery and be posted to burn units, scheduled to be constructed at every district under the institute, he said.

Proper treatment in the first 24 hours is crucial for burn patients so units at the districts will lessen sufferings, said Dr Samanta.

Now, only two expert surgeons are

created per year while there are 52 surgeons

in the country's eight burn units, including

four in the capital, he said. As per the project's sources, the institute will also train up nurses, paramedics, physiotherapists and persons specialising in


dressings. They add that it would have 500 beds, including 50 for the intensive care unit; 12 operating theatres, four each for the burn, emergency and plastic surgery units; and

## Bus cylinder blast 15 get Nat'l injures 15

At least 15 passengers of a bus were injured as the vehicle caught fire after explosion of its CNG cylinder on Dhaka-Aricha highway in Savar, outside the capital, yesterday.

Witnesses said the cylinder of the Dhaka-bound bus from Gazipur exploded as it crashed into the central reservation at Jhorpul around 4:30pm.

On information, a firefighter team rushed in and doused the flames, said Rabiul Al-Amin, station officer of Savar Fire Service and Civil Defence.

Of the injured, five were admitted to Enam Medical College Hospital and the rest to different hospitals and clinics in Savar, said police. An injured person was shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital from a Hemayetpur clinic as his condition was critical, said Jamal Uddin, chairman of the clinic. Hospital sources said most of them were injured while trying to come out of the bus hurriedly and some suffered burns. Vehicular movement on the highway remained halted for around an hour, causing a
