"My feelings for Bangladesh, Brahmaputra and music lovers of my motherland are ever alive in my heart. Whenever I visit Bangladesh, I don't feel like leaving," said an enthused Mitali Mukherjee in an exclusive interview with a few cultural journalists, while Citi Bank, NA was honouring the renowned singer this year with "Gaan-e Gaan-e Gunijon Sangbordhona".

Mitali shared her memories of recording the timeless song "Ei Dunia Ekhon To Ar" for which she received a national award for the film "Dui Poishar Alta." The song took the music industry by storm. "I first recorded the song for BTV. I told Alauddin Bhai (eminent musician Alauddin Ali) to give me a song like (sings) 'Keu Konodin Amarey To Kotha Dilo Na'. Then he created the song and I recorded it," said the artiste.

Mitali began her formal training in classical music under Pt. Mithun Dey. Her parents were well-versed in classical and Nazrul Sangeet and groomed her in music.

Mitali tied the knot with ghazal singer Bhupinder Singh in 1983 and settled down in Mumbai.

She performs a diverse range of songs-classical, ghazal or popular -- with equal passion. She may be away, but the gifted Mitali Mukherjee has taken our culture beyond our borders.

The story encircles Dhrubo and Meghla, both runaways from home. Their paths cross and the duo come closer.


Nobel said, "I don't get enough time for acting due to a busy schedule. But this play is different; I enjoyed working in it."

China's ancient capital, Xi'an, has thousands of years of rich history and heritage, the most significant of them being the Tang Dynasty (618-907 AD), when China achieved great artistic and cultural heights. Delegates of a recent media trip to the city organised by China Daily newspaper, The Daily Star's sister organisation in the Asia News Network, were treated to a majestic theatrical performance highlighting the cultural brilliance of the Tang Dynasty, at the Sunshine Lido Grand Theatre. The European baroque-style architecture of the theatre hosts a delicious dumpling banquet, followed by the set of performances.

Maksuda Iqbal Nipa's solo exhibit opens at Bengal Art Lounge


