are increasing but the state has not taken any strict action against the perpetrators, they added. "Our country has turned into a den for

Metropolitan Magistrate Mollah Saiful Alam recorded the statements of Sagar, Shafique, Raju, Shafiqul and Md Jasim, police and court sources said. Police are yet to arrest Sohel and Farid and the victim's

family alleged that it would have come sooner if police had been prompt. A milad-mahfil was held at the victim's Chandpur village residence yesterday. Sohel carried out the torture for hours on Tuesday accus-
