


The video, directed by Hannah Lux Davis (who helmed Grande's videos for "Bang Bang" and "Love Me Harder", followed soon after.


Raaga & Rhythm at Chhayanaut today



Roger Daltrey, frontman of British rock band "The Who", made his first guitar from a block of wood, a cherry red Strat copy, and joined a band called "The Detours" as lead vocals. They told him he had to bring a guitar, and within a few weeks he showed up with it. When his father bought him an Epiphone guitar in 1959, he became the lead guitarist for the band. "The Detours" was later renamed "The Who" in 1964, and went on to sell 100 million records, with 18 Gold, 12 Platinum and 5 Multi-Platinum album awards in the United States alone.
