Abducted boy found murdered, 7 arrested

A minor boy, abducted from Kadimnagar village under Ghoraghat municipality on Tuesday, was found murdered at a mango orchard at the village yesterday.

The boy was identified as Parosh Chandra Saha, son of Keshab Chandra Saha. Police arrested seven people of the same village, suspecting their involvement in the abduction and murder of Parosh.

The arrestees are Zillur

Rahman, 20, Mamun, 20, Ibrahim, 18, Firoz, 22, Kamal, 45, Shefali, 35 and Nurbanu, 32. Police said they will produce the arrestees before a Dinajpur court today, seeking remand for them.

Protesting the killing, villagers set fire to the houses of the seven arrestees. Being informed, firefighters from Hakimpur and Phulbari upazila headquarters rushed to the village and doused the flames.

Police said a gang of criminals picked up Parosh from near their house on Tuesday afternoon. They later demanded Tk 5 lakh as ransom from his father over cell phone.

Victim's father Keshab Chandra informed the police of the matter and filed a case with Ghoraghat Police Station in this regard.

Locals found the body of Parosh at a mango orchard at the village yesterday morning and informed the police, who recovered the body and sent it to Dinajpur Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

Ijtema in Jessore

Around 2,000 volunteers are there to help the devotees, he added. Ten medical teams will provide treatment to the devotees, a source of the organisers said. The Ijtema will end after Zohr prayers tomorrow.

2 youths commit 'suicide'

Two youths allegedly committed suicide in Sharsa and Jhikargachha upazilas of Jessore district on Wednesday. The deceased were identified as Khalilur Rahman, 25, son of Shamsul Haque of Gorpara village in Sharsha upazila, and Abbas Ali, 23, son of Abdur Rahim of Panisara village in Jhikargachha upazila. Police and family members said Khalil took poison at their house on Tuesday night when his father refused to give him money for business. Khalil was taken to Jessore Medical College Hospital where he died the following day. In another incident, Abbas committed suicide by taking poison over a family feud on Tuesday night.

Day labourer electrocuted

A day labourer was electrocuted at Nashrapur village in Dhunat upazila of the district on Tuesday. The deceased is Amir Hossain, 55, of Dheruhati village in the upazila. Police said Amir came in contact with a live electric wire when he was cutting the branches of a tree in the area. He died on the spot.

Human trafficker arrested

Criminal Investigation Department (CID) in a drive arrested an alleged human trafficker from Khwaza Yunus Ali Medical College Hospital area in Enayeturpura upazila of the district on Wednesday afternoon. The arrestee was identified as Suruzzaman alias Sura Dalal, 40, son of Abdul Hossain, a resident of Brahman village in the upazila. He was accused in a human trafficking case filed with Enayeturpura Police Station. A team of CID conducted a drive in the area around 4:00pm and arrested Suruzzaman, said Sirajganj CID police.

Listed criminal killed

A listed criminal was killed allegedly by an unidentified gang in Gohatta area under Sonargaon upazila of the district on Wednesday. The deceased, Arman Hossain, son of Monjur Kader of Comilla, used to reside at his maternal uncle's house at Gohatta village in the upazila. Quoting locals, police said a gang waylaid Arman in front of 'Afia Filling Station' on Dhaka-Chittagong highway while he was returning to his Sonargaon house from Dhaka by a motorbike. The gang hacked Arman indiscriminately with sharp weapons. They also slit his throat and left the scene, police said, adding that Arman died on the spot.

15 held while going to India illegally

Members of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) arrested 15 Bangladeshi nationals while they were going to India illegally through Putkhali border on Wednesday night.
