Govt to remove unplanned installations
Will punish violators; Mosharraf Hossain tells parliament

Those who have interfered with the master plan of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban Complex and built different structures including graves in and around it must be brought to justice, Housing and Public Works Minister Mosharraf Hossain told parliament last night.

He said there was no space marked anywhere in the master plan for building graves.

"But governments have given instructions over the years to build graves and different other structures," he added saying that the government would restore the master plan after getting it from the Architectural Archive of Pennsylvania University, USA.

Architect Louis I Kahn's plan for the complex has so far been grossly interfered with through the building of the grave of BNP founder Ziaur Rahman, Bangabandhu International Conference Centre, the Planning Commission, and some other structures, the minister said.

The JS building sits on a 200-acre land and is part of an 800-acre citadel

Uttara cops open fire at check post

Four escape on foot from fleeing car

Uttara police shot three rounds at a car yesterday noon when it beat a Jasimuddin Road checkpost and sped off, starting a four-kilometre chase.

Four persons from the car later fled on foot after ditching it on Road 9/C, Sector 5.

The vehicle hit several cars, rickshaws and rickshaw-vans while the four inside hurled brick chips at law enforcers during the chase, Uttara West Police Station Officer-in-Charge (OC) Ali Hossain Khan told The

Daily Star. There is no report of anybody getting hurt.

The Uttara east police shot at the car first at a check point when the car sped off ignoring their signal to stop. Hot on their trail, police shot two more rounds at the car as the chase went on through crowded, narrow roads, said Uttara East Police Station OC Abu Bakar Miah. He said they were now trying to find the car's owner.

The roads and buildings along the chase route were being searched for the four and any video footage, said police.

SC okays increasing retirement age of FF govt staff to 65

The Supreme Court yesterday upheld a High Court verdict that directed the authorities concerned of the government to place before the cabinet a proposal in 60 days for increasing the retirement age of freedom fighters, who are in government service, to 65 years.

Hearing an appeal filed by the government challenging the HC verdict, the apex court, however, said the government can take any decision for increasing retirement age of the freedom fighters.

Following a writ petition, the HC on January 14 ordered the secretaries to the ministries of public administration, liberation war affairs, and law to place before the cabinet the proposal in 60 days for increasing freedom fighters' retirement age from 57 to 65.

Petitioners' counsel Azahar Ullah Bhuiyan said the prime minister's office in July 2006 issued a proposal for increasing freedom fighters' retirement age to 65 years following

Families of slain cops renew call for justice

Get financial assistance from Police Headquarters

The only thing families of the three recently slain policemen want is justice.

The families renewed their call for bringing the killers to book at a programme, organised by the Police Headquarters yesterday for giving financial assistance to them.

Inspector General of Police AKM Shahidul Hoque handed over a total of Tk 61 lakh to the families of 14 deceased

policemen, including constable Mukul Hossain, assistant sub-inspector (ASI) Ibrahim Mollah and ASI Sujaul Islam, who were killed recently while performing their duties.

The others either died in accidents or of diseases.

"Definitely the money I got today will help me support my family but I want my son's killer to hang," said Shahidul Hossain, father of Mukul, who was hacked to death at a checkpoint in Ashulia on November 4.
