For his contribution to education and Bangla literature, Prof Anisuzzaman has received numerous accolades including Bangla Academy Award, Ekushey Padak, Independence Award and Padma Bhushan, India's third highest civilian award.

Contacted, Anisuzzaman told The Daily Star, "Police did not inform me anything about it but I came to know it from television reports."

Meanwhile, Rajshahi University teachers and students yesterday protested the death threat to fiction writer Hasan Azizul Haque.

An unknown caller threatened Hasan with death over the phone on Sunday.

Rajshahi police said they were providing Hasan with security and investigating the matter to identify the caller.

Mahmud when he met Bharti at state-owned Ashoka Hotel in New Delhi where she hosted a high tea for him yesterday.

Emerging from the meeting, Mahmud told reporters that he invited Bharti to Dhaka for the JRC meeting "very soon", which she accepted.

Replying to a question when the meeting would be held, he said it would be set through diplomatic channels.

Bharti, talking to reporters separately a short while later, said she had accepted Mahmud's invitation, and the mutually convenient date would be finalised.

In 2010, the last meeting of ministerial-level JRC was held in Delhi.

Mahmud said he took up the issue of sharing of waters of the Teesta and other common rivers.

Mahmud said Bharti had assured him that India would not do anything that would be detrimental to the interests of Bangladesh.

Asked about the Teesta water-sharing deal, Bharti said India has a cooperative federal structure and talks are on with the concerned state (West Bengal) for evolving a consensus on the issue.

Answering another question, she said she would hold talks with West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee on the Teesta issue before attending the JRC meeting in Dhaka.

This correspondent talked to the authorities of at least 12 halls of the university's 20 dormitories and found that the annual charge at Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman Hall, Sir Salimullah Hall, Shaheed Sergeant Zahurul Haque Hall, Haji Muhammad Mohsin Hall, Kabi Jasimuddin Hall, Muktiyoddha Ziaur Rahman Hall, Begum Rokeya Hall and Sir AF Rahman Hall is Tk 360.

The Jagannath Hall charges Tk 800, including Tk 250 for Saraswati Puja, while Shamsunnahar Hall collects Tk 560, including Tk 200 for religious programmes and medical services, Fazlul Haque Hall Tk 900 and Shahidulh Hall Tk 1,200. The two latter dormitories hiked the charges recently.

Prof Shafiu said the annual fees at Bijoy Ekattor Hall was higher than many others halls because running the newly built dormitory is costly. "We have to pay many of our staff from the hall fund."

### PROTESTS

Pragatishil Chhatra Jote, an alliance of seven left-leaning student organisations, brought out a procession on the DU campus last evening, demanding that the authorities cut the charge immediately.

Earlier in the day, leaders of the platform at a press conference at Modhur Canteen issued a seven-day ultimatum to the hall authorities to reduce the charge. They warned of waging a tougher movement if their demand was not met within this period.

Chhatra Jote leaders said they would submit a memorandum to

DU Vice Chancellor AAMS Arefin Siddique today in this regard.

Talking to this newspaper, the DU VC said, "As the establishment fee and other maintenance costs of the newly built hall are higher than those in other dormitories, students will have to pay more to stay here. The annual fee of the hall is affordable."

About the process of fixing the annual charge, he said the hall authorities initially propose an amount which is later finalised by the university authorities.

"The facilities at the hall are not better than those in other dormitories of the university. But I have to pay about 10 times more than my friends," said a student of Bijoy Ekattor Hall on condition of anonymity.

## 13 Kurdish rebels killed in new Turkey air strikes

Turkish warplanes carried out a new wave of air strikes against Kurdistan Workers' Party (PKK) militants in the southeast, killing 13 rebels overnight, the army said Monday.

"Thirteen terrorists have been neutralised," in the remote Hakkari province, on the border with Iraq, the general staff said in a statement on its website.

Meanwhile in Istanbul, police detained at least 13 suspected PKK members on Monday after receiving intelligence that they were planning to attack shops and government buildings in the city with Molotov cocktails, Dogan news agency said.

Abed suggested unifying primary and secondary education ministries, but making a separate one to deal with the higher education.

He also expressed disappointment with the low budgetary allocation, which is around 1.8 percent of Bangladesh's Gross Domestic Product, for education. It should be raised to 4 percent of the GDP, he said.

On the health sector, Abed, who leads the world's largest NGO, said health shocks were pushing some 3 to 5 million people below the poverty line every year. Despite progress in health indicators, the number of children suffering malnutrition, mothers dying while giving births is very high, he said.

Rasheda K Chowdhury, director of the Campaign for Popular Education, suggested the government should raise fund for education through imposing tax.

Bangladesh has to focus on domestic resources. "Development partners will be there, but the

government should be at the driving seat," she said.

Finance Minister AMA Muhith, who chaired the session, said he endorsed the idea of unifying primary and secondary education ministries and improving the governance of educational institutions.

As Bangladesh grows into a middle-income country by 2021, it needs more investment in training health staff and improving governance, said Navaratnasamy Paranietharan, Bangladesh's country representative of the World Health Organization.

The allocation for health in the current fiscal year is Tk 11,146 crore, which is 4.45 percent of the total budget. WHO suggested increasing it to 15 percent of the budget.

Jeff Nankivell, director general of the Asia-Pacific in foreign affairs, trade and development, Canada, suggested investments in market-related skills development, ensuring quality and equity in education

cargo up to the "discharge" point to Agartala, the capital city of Indian state of Tripura, avoiding transshipment at Akhaura on the border.

A day after signing a Standard Operating Procedure for implementing the coastal shipping for cargo, the two countries yesterday inked a similar deal for enforcing passenger and cruise service between them.

Replying to a question, Fakhru said both coastal shipping in cargo and passenger movement were expected to start sometime next year.

He said goods by ships between

Bangladesh and India could reach other's ports in maximum four to five days by ships under the coastal shipping agreement.

The sea and river ports to be connected under the agreement are Mongla, Chittagong, Paira, Khulna, Narayanganj, Ashuganj and Pangaon in Bangladesh and Chennai, Visakhapatnam, Krishnapatnam, Paradip, Kakinada, Haldia and Kolkata in India.

Fakhru said coastal shipping in cargo between the two countries could generate thousands of jobs for sailors and labourers in dockyards.

## France strikes ISIS targets

The French planes took off from bases in Jordan and the United Arab Emirates, in an operation that was conducted in co-ordination with US forces.

Shortly after the raid, the French air force released a video of the imposing planes taking off for their bombing mission.

Meanwhile, France President Francois Hollande has said his country is committed to "destroying" the IS.

Speaking at a joint session of both houses of parliament yesterday, he declared that "France is at war". He promised to eradicate terrorism, but not at the expense of France's freedom.

He said he would table a bill to extend the state of emergency declared after the attacks for three months and would suggest changes to the constitution.

France's military campaign against IS in Iraq and Syria will also intensify, Hollande added.

IS says it carried out the attacks on bars, restaurants, a concert hall and a stadium in which 129 people died.

The French president said he would travel to meet US President Barack Obama and Russian Vladimir Putin in the coming days to discuss action against the group.

Anti-IS activist group, Raqqa is Being Slaughtered Silently, has said that no civilians were killed or injured in the French bombing raids, citing sources in local hospitals.

strikes against IS are ahead - the French nuclear-powered aircraft carrier Charles De Gaulle will set sail for the Persian Gulf on November 18, as was announced before the attacks on Friday.

The aircraft carrier will make more planes available for use against ISIS, and will also dramatically cut the time it takes for French planes to reach their targets in the region.

The Charles De Gaulle is capable of carrying up to 40 jets and helicopters, and will "bolster Paris' firepower in the region," as President Francois Hollande said.

Hollande called the Paris attacks an "act of war" in a speech on Saturday, and said "France will be merciless towards these barbarians."

Prime Minister Manuel Valls has also vowed to "destroy" those behind the attacks.

Thousands of French soldiers have been deployed on the streets of the country, to provide reinforcements to regular police while France endures a three-day period of national mourning and a state of emergency.

### 'WAR' DECLARED

Also yesterday, French Interior Minister Bernard Cazeneuve said that "war" had been declared on France and that "anybody who attacks the Republic, the Republic will fight back."

"It is not they who will destroy the Republic. The Republic will destroy them," he said.

France has been part of the U.S.-

led coalition of nations fighting ISIS from the air, but after Friday's attacks that killed 129 people and wounded more than 350 others, France has flown more sorties.

ISIS has claimed responsibility for the attacks, which France's President described as "an act of war."

**'STRIKES ARE SYMBOLIC'**  
France has been conducting airstrikes against IS targets in Syria since September as part of a US-led coalition, reports CNN.

A senior Obama administration official said that the United States was "working closely with the French to develop targets."

The US military probably handed over a list of targets the coalition was planning to strike to the French to let them fly the sorties, said retired Lt Gen Mark Hertling, a military analyst. "These target packages were already in folders, as they're called, and I'm sure the central command handed them over to the French fighters to attack for the symbolism of France being back in the fight."

The timing of the new airstrikes probably is no coincidence, analysts said.

"Clearly, it's a military activity, but it really sends a very strong political message, and it's all for internal consumption within France," said retired Maj. Gen. James "Spider" Marks, a CNN military analyst. "This is very visceral."

the government should understand that their countries want to help Bangladesh to achieve its socio-economic development goals and become a middle-income country.

"We don't see anything to gain from pressing the Bangladesh government to accept the existence of IS in Bangladesh. I don't believe that any friend or development partner of Bangladesh wants to create a situation like the ones in Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, Pakistan and Libya, as claimed by the prime minister," said a senior diplomat of a Western country.

Diplomats seeking anonymity said no one is leaning on the government to accept the IS existence in Bangladesh, rather many countries, after the killing of two foreigners, have come up with offer to help Bangladesh.

Regarding the IS claims after recent incidents, they said instead of outright rejecting any claim, it is wise for the government to seriously investigate the claims.

In response to a question, another diplomat of a top European country said the West's interests in the Middle East and Bangladesh are far from the same.

"We have been helping the country for development, flourishing democracy and governance since its independence, so how can we harm Bangladesh," the diplomat said, adding that many of these countries stood by Bangladesh during its independence struggle.

Another diplomat of an influential Asian country, on condition of anonymity, said the government should concentrate on arresting the culprits without politicising the matter.

He said, "We are just concerned about the safety of our people staying in Bangladesh."

A diplomat of another influential Asian country, which is also a very close friend of Bangladesh, admitted that they also have information that the terrorists' threats are true.

He, however, said there has been high level contact between the two countries and "we have all our support for you [Bangladesh]."

In the petition submitted to the HC on November 2, she also challenged the legality of the appointments of the first three judges to the International Crimes Tribunal-1 which dealt with her husband's war crimes case.

Farhat prayed to the HC to declare the appointments of the three judges illegal. She claimed that the provision of the 15th constitutional amendment, which allows trial of individuals for committing crimes against humanity, conflicts with a provision of the original constitution which stipulated that the accused will be put on trial as a group of individuals.

Yesterday, the HC bench of Justice Tariq ul Hakim and Justice Farid Ahmed Shibli dropped the petition from its hearing list, saying that the issues mentioned in the prayer have already been settled by the HC.

The Appellate Division has already delivered a judgment on the appeal of Salauddin Quader Chowdhury in the war crimes case, the bench said, adding that time will be wasted if the writ petition is entertained at this stage.

The court told petitioner's counsel Mohsen Rashid that he could move the writ petition before another HC bench.

Jamaat-e-Islami leader Mojaheed and BNP's Salauddin on October 14 submitted the review petitions to the SC, seeking acquittal on all the charges levelled against them.

In the petitions, the two sought reconsideration of the SC judgments on the ground that they were sentenced for "offences committed by others".

The SC upheld the capital punishment of the two politicians in June and July after hearing their appeals against the verdicts of two war crimes tribunals.

The International Crimes Tribunal issued death warrants for the two on October 1, a day after the SC released its full verdicts.

A similar scheme was introduced in France in 2014, with mixed results. While a six-month trial found that paying people to cycle to work did increase the numbers doing so, the majority had been using public transport, rather than private vehicles. Of those making the move from cars to bicycles, most had already been carpooling.

Sonia Bashir Kabir, managing director of Microsoft Bangladesh, said the initiative would provide an opportunity to the young people in the ICT sector to present their success stories.

From the onset, Brac Bank had designs to present the ICT sector as a mainstream one, said its Managing Director Selim RF Hussain.

"That's why we are supporting this initiative," he said, adding that small and medium enterprises in the ICT sector also need attention.

"Without the power of ICT no business can function properly. And for this, we have become a part of the event," said Ashwani Nayar, general manager of Le Meridien Dhaka.

The award ceremony will recognise winners in six categories: e-business, ICT start-up, ICT person, ICT product, and ICT solution providers in the local and international arenas.

Sources said the Indians assured Bangladesh of handing over the top Bangladeshi criminals hiding in India following examination of legal matters. They thanked Bangladesh for deporting Chetia and asked for other Indian criminals in Bangladesh.

It was only on November 11 when Bangladesh deported Ulfa leader Anup Chetia, and a day after that India handed over prime accused in the sensational seven-murder case of Narayanganj Nur Hossain.

According to law enforcement agencies, around 40 top criminals are either in Indian jails or are hiding in that country.

He said with the signing of Land Boundary Agreement and its implementation both Bangladesh and India have been enjoying the warmest ever relationship.

Meanwhile, the Indian delegation led by Rajiv Mehrishi paid a courtesy call on Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal and invited him on behalf of Indian Home Minister Rajnath Singh to visit India, sources said.

The home minister accepted the invitation, the sources added.
