## Siddikur misses cut in Manila

Siddikur Rahman missed the cut in the Resorts Manila World Masters after finishing the second round tied for 91st position yesterday.

Having started the day at 87th, Siddikur exchanged three bogeys for two birdies at the Manila Southwinds Golf and Country Club on Friday to settle for a one-over (73) and an aggregate score of three-over (147). That put him three strokes short of the cut-mark, 144, with 67 golfers making the weekend rounds.

This was the seventh time that the two-time Asian Tour winner failed to make the cut this season, which makes this the most number of times since he became a regular on the tour. Having struggled in the earlier part of the season, Siddikur had shown signs of resurgence recently, having made the cut in all six events since the start of October. He had even put himself in a winning position twice this month, but eventually failed to break his two-year title-drought.

The ace golfer will get almost two weeks to get his composure back before taking part in the Ho Tram Open in Vietnam, beginning on December 3.

## BFF calls emergency meeting

The meeting will inform the executive body about the revenues which the game's governing body generated from the match and will also issue letters of thanks to the different stakeholders and different departments of the government," said BFF general secretary Abu Nayeem Shohag.

However, it has been learnt that the meeting is also likely to discuss the matter of Sheikh Jamal DC, who took their nine national players to its club president's office in Gulshan just the day before Bangladesh's match against Australia. The meeting may also discuss the statements made by Sheikh Jamal president Manzur Kader's towards the game's governing body.

## Gala concert ushers in BPL 3

**BPL** Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) president Nazmul Hassan Papon has said that he hopes the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) will help local players hone their skills and improve ahead of next year's T20 Asia Cup and World Twenty20. The BCB boss was speaking at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium last night during the official inauguration of the franchise-based Twenty20 tournament, with matches scheduled to get underway in Dhaka from tomorrow, as a gala concert ushered in the third edition of the money-spinning event.

"Even though we are a very good team in ODIs and are all-but-unbeatable at home in that format, the truth is that we have not yet achieved the same status in Twenty20s," Papon said. "That is why, with the Asia Cup and the World T20 coming up, I think BPL will be specifically beneficial for our cricket. By playing alongside more than 140 foreign players, our boys will get the opportunity to develop their skills."

Papon asked the BCB selectors to try and

unearth at least a couple of promising players from this tournament and consider them for the national team.

Papon's speech was followed by the official inauguration of the tournament by Finance Minister Abul Maal Abdul Muhith, before six Tigers -- Soumya Sarkar (Rangpur Riders), Tamim Iqbal (Chittagong Vikings), Nasir Hossain (Dhaka Dynamites), Mashrafe Bin Mortaza (Comilla Victorians), Mashfiqur Rahim (Sylhet Superstars) and Mahmudullah Riyad (Barisal Bulls) -- delivered impromptu speeches on behalf of their respective BPL teams.

Although they all wear the Red and Green when playing as Tigers, the six cricketers said that their brotherhood will be set aside for the next 24 days as their goals will be to see their respective teams succeed in the BPL.

Earlier, the show had started after a little hiccup as a technician, working with the lighting on top of the stage's scaffolding, fell some twenty meters down to the ground before being quickly taken away to an adjacent hospital.

But the 15,000-something crowd, which had gathered to enjoy a gala night full of music, and

of course to see Bollywood superstars Hrithik Roshan and Jacqueline Fernandez up close, were soon immersed in a music fest. The music fest kicked off with an as-usual powerful performance by legendary rock band LRB, led by the evergreen Ayub Bacchu, after a brief prelude by Sadia Islam Mou and her dance troupe.

The day ended just as it began, as a dazzling fireworks display set the sky above the SBNS alight.

## Pakistan smoked by Js

A brilliant century by Jos Buttler and a more routine one from Jason Roy fired England to an 84-run win over Pakistan in a high-scoring final one-day international in Dubai on Friday and a 3-1 victory in the series.

England piled up 355 for five thanks to Roy's maiden ODI hundred and Buttler's record-breaking 116 not out.

Pakistan scored quickly in reply but lost wickets steadily and were all out for 271 in the 41st over.

Buttler's extraordinary knock came after being promoted to number four at the end of a year in which he often struggled for runs.

His century off 46 balls broke his own England record and he hit eight sixes -- another national best -- and 10 fours.

Roy's innings, if less spectacular, was equally valuable after his opening partner

Alex Hales fell for 22.

After the exchange, Pakistan kept up with the rate for more than 35 overs but steadily lost wickets.

David Willey snapped up the first two, dismissing openers Azhar Ali and Ahmed Shehzad before running out Mohammad Hafeez, dropped by Hales, for 37.

Babar Azam was another batsman who scored at a run-a-ball, but he was caught off Adil Rashid.

The teams will now play a three-match Twenty20 series, starting on Thursday.

## BD youths embarrassed

Bangladesh under-19s crashed to an 82-run defeat against their Indian counterparts in the Under-19 Triseries one-day cricket tournament opener at the Jadavpur University Complex in Kolkata yesterday.

Bangladesh appeared to have a good chance of winning, as they restricted India to just 159 runs. Mehedi Hasan took three wickets while Saleh Ahmed and Abdul Halim took two each as the Indian batters failed to find their feet on a tough pitch.

However, a woeful batting performance from Bangladesh saw them fall well short of the mark as they were bowled out for just 76 in 22 overs.

Only two Bangladeshi batsmen managed to score double digits, while the top-five Bangladeshi batsmen could combine to score a paltry 17 runs.

Bangladesh skipper Mehedi Hasan was fuming at his batsmen after his game for their lacklustre performance.

"We've been playing together for about three years now and this is for the first time, I've seen such an atrocious batting. I totally blame the batsmen," Bangladeshi skipper Mehedy Hasan Miraz said.

India now have five points, while Bangladesh are yet to open their account in the tournament also involving Afghanistan. India will take on Afghanistan tomorrow in their second match.

## A scare for Mash

Prior to the opening ceremony of the Bangladesh Premier League (BPL) yesterday, everyone was jarred by the news of Mashrafe Bin Mortaza's ankle injury sustained at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium.

However, it was later revealed that the injury was not serious and that the Tigers skipper is still going to lead his franchise, the Comilla Victorians, in his side's opening fixture against Chittagong Vikings tomorrow.

The news scared a lot of the cricket faithful, because Mashrafe has been playing consistently for a long time after being plagued by injuries throughout his career. And every time he gets hurt, like when he had an accident in late-June or when he recently suffered from dengue, people worry as they wait with bated breath. So when the news that Mashrafe twisted his right ankle during practice at the National Cricket Academy ground yesterday, emotions ran deep.

"There is nothing to be worried about. Hopefully he [Mashrafe Bin Mortaza] will be back in training tomorrow and will play the first game," said national team physio Bayyedul Islam Khan. Mashrafe also assured that the injury was not serious.

Another Comilla Victorians pacer, Kamrul Islam Rabbi, also suffered a thumb injury during practice on Thursday and he will not be available for selection for at least the next seven days as the young pacer has been given a week's rest.

## De Lange in as cover for Steyn

South Africa have added fast bowler Marchant de Lange to their squad for the final two Test matches in India as concerns remain over the fitness of attack spearhead Dale Steyn.

Trailing the four-match series 1-0, Steyn missed this week's washed-out second Test in Bangalore and is still working his way back from a groin injury ahead of the third match in Nagpur starting on Wednesday.

"At the moment we only have three fit seamers in Morne Morkel, Kagiso Rabada and Kyle Abbott, so with Dale still struggling with a groin injury, we decided to bring Marchant in as cover," coach Russell Domingo said in a statement on Friday.
