

Irony of fate

The fate of guerilla fighters Bodi, Jewel, Altaf Mahmud and Rumi were sealed only a few days before the Gen Yahya regime declared presidential clemency for freedom fighters captured by the Pakistani forces in 1971.

Freedom Fighter Zahir Uddin Jalal, who was at the same camp where those guerrillas were kept, 42 years later told the court about the role Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed and Matiur Rahman Nizami played in having them executed.

Jalal described how the two war criminals advised Pakistan army Captain Kayum to shoot the

SEEKING CLEMENCY
Govt, family

The government and the families of Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojaheed and Salauddin Quader Chowdhury yesterday came up with contradictory versions of whether the two convicted war criminals had sought presidential clemency.

While two ministers categorically said both the war criminals sought clemency and the president turned down their pleas, the families claimed Mojaheed and Salauddin didn't ask for mercy.

The war criminals were hanged at 12:55am today.

World unites against terror

UN Security Council unanimously votes to 'eradicate' Islamic State

With a rare rapidity of purpose, the United Nations has unanimously adopted a sweeping anti-IS resolution imploring the world to unite to defeat Isis. It called on member states to "redouble and coordinate their efforts" to prevent further terrorist horrors by the group and "eradicate" its safe havens straddling parts of Iraq and Syria.

The vote in the Security Council held barely 24 hours after the text was presented in New York by the French ambassador to the UN, François Delattre. Stunned by the attacks of one week ago in Paris, the French government had correctly calculated that sympathy and a new sense of crisis in the chamber would trump months of dithering and division on the combined issues of IS and the Syrian conflict.

The pressure was greatest on Russia and China, both veto-wielding permanent members traditionally averse to any resolutions that could be perceived as interference in another country's affairs. But Russia recently suffered the downing of the Metrojet airliner over Sinai bearing passengers from Egypt to St Petersburg and this week IS claimed it had executed a Chinese national.

The resolution does not invoke Chapter VII of the UN

Trade on Facebook counting losses

Viper, a Bangladeshi brand of leather goods that does its business on Facebook, lost more than 90 percent of its business in the last three days after the government blocked the social media platform.

Mostafizur Rahaman, owner of Viper, said they have two other physical outlets in the city but most of his business came from Facebook.

"Every week I usually spend around \$100 on Facebook campaigns and now it has halted completely," Mostafizur said.

Saiful Islam, an entrepreneur of AmarGadget.com, pioneer of the country's Facebook-commerce initiative, said his company's sales came down more than 70 percent because of the ban on Facebook.

"Recently, I changed my business policy from f-commerce [Facebook-commerce] to e-commerce that's why it is not hurting me that much, but the people who are only depending on f-commerce, their sales dropped to around 5 percent," said Saiful.
