Following suit after the terror alert was raised to the highest level of four because of what officials said Saturday was an "imminent threat."
Central Brussels, usually bustling, was virtually deserted, with police and troops on patrol.
Interior Minister Jan Jambon said the authorities were looking not just for Paris suspect Salah Abdeslam who managed to slip past French security forces after the carnage in the City of Light.
He warned that the capture of Abdeslam, a Belgian-born 26-year-old whose brother Ibrahim blew himself up at a cafe in Paris, would not in itself end the threat.
"It involves several suspects and that is why we have put in place such exceptional measures," the Belga news agency cited Jambon as telling Flemish television.
Justice Minister Koen Geens said in a separate Belga report he expected the metro to re-open on Monday "if all passes off normally... We are not going to paralyse Brussels economically."
Belgium and the capital, home to the European Union and Nato, are no strangers to Islamist violence.

Four people were shot dead at the Brussels Jewish museum last year, and in January security forces killed two suspects linked to the Charlie Hebdo killings in Paris.
The UN Security Council on Friday authorised nations to "take all necessary measures" to fight jihadist violence after a wave of attacks, including the downing of a Russian aircraft in Egypt with the loss of 224 lives and the storming of a luxury hotel in Mali which left 19 dead.
Obama yesterday said he would press ahead with a visit to Paris for UN climate talks in December, calling on world leaders to show similar resolve.
"The most powerful tool we have to fight ISIL is to say that we're not afraid," he said.
Russian President Vladimir Putin said the Mali attack, in which six Russians died, showed terrorism was a global threat which must be confronted "with the broadest international cooperation."
French President Francois Hollande next week meets a series of world leaders, including Obama and Putin alongside Germany's Angela Merkel and

Britain's David Cameron to discuss what can be done to counter the IS threat.
In Turkey, police arrested a Belgian of Moroccan origin in the resort of Antalya, the site of last week's G20 summit, along with two other suspects, probably Syrians.
Ahmet Dahmani, 26, reportedly scouted out targets for the Paris attacks, which saw gunmen and suicide bombers target bars, restaurants, a rock concert and the national football stadium.
The suspected ringleader, Abdelhamid Abaaoud, died in a massive police raid in Paris on Wednesday along with his cousin Hasna Aitboulahcen, reportedly a one-time party girl who turned to radical Islam about six months ago.
Abaaoud was a notorious Belgian jihadist thought to be fighting in Syria and his presence in Europe has raised troubling questions about a Europe-wide breakdown in intelligence and border security.
Questions remain too over what role Salah Abdeslam -- who used to run a bar with his brother Ibrahim in Brussels -- played in the bloodshed.

ATP World Tour Finals Djokovic beats Federer

Novak Djokovic capped a remarkable season with victory over Roger Federer to claim a record fourth straight ATP World Tour Finals title.
The world number one from Serbia won 6-3 6-4 in 80 minutes at London's O2 Arena. Djokovic also made amends for defeat by six-time champion Federer in the group stage on Tuesday. He ends the year with 11 titles including three Grand Slams, taking his total to 10 majors.
The 28-year-old has now won the season finale five times and surpasses Ivan Lendl's 1987 achievement, when he won his third straight Tour Finals title in New York.
DJOKOVIC A CLASS APART
The defeat by Federer on Tuesday had been his first indoors since 2012, but Djokovic responded in simply irresistible style as he despatched first Rafael Nadal and then, in the final, Federer.
It ended with a double fault from Federer as even the 17-time Grand Slam champion wilted under the pressure of such relentless accuracy from his opponent.
Aside from the trophy, another 1,300 ranking points and the cheque for £1.4m, Djokovic also draws level with Federer at 22-22 in career meetings.

and Chittagong to ward off any untoward incident centring on the execution of the duo.
SALAUDDIN'S BURIAL
Self-proclaimed brigadier against pro-liberation forces in 1971, Salauddin was buried at Madhyagahira in Chittagong's Razoan.
Escorted by law enforcers from Dhaka Central Jail, an ambulance with the body reached his village house, Baitul Bilal, around 9:00am, reports our Chittagong correspondent.
Salauddin's younger son Hummam Quader Chowdhury received the body from the deputy jailer, Mazharul Islam, at the premises.
A namaz-e-janaza was held in front of a local mosque around 9:20am, led by Hejafat-e-Islam's senior Nayeb-e-Ameer Mohibullah Babunagari.
Earlier, additional law enforcers were deployed in Razoan upazila and around Salauddin's residence at Cahira.
At a press conference after the burial, Hummam claimed that it was nothing but propaganda that his father had sought presidential mercy.
He said his father was a tiger and that tiger never bows to anybody.
"My father has been killed through an illegal judgment. But I am fortunate that I have received his body whereas many are losing their relatives to forced disappearance and murder in the current situation of the country."
Someday the trial of his father's "killing" would also be held in the country, Hummam added.
MOJAHEED'S BURIAL
The body of Mojaheed, chief of notorious Al-Badr force in 1971, reached his ancestral home in Khabashpur village of Faridpur around 6:35am, reports a correspondent from Faridpur.
Executive magistrates Rubayet Hayat Shiplu and Mandeep Ghorai received the

body on behalf of the local authorities.
His namaz-e-janaza was held at Khabashpur Ideal Madrasa ground around 6:55am before he was buried beside its main entrance, said Abdur Rashid, the district's additional deputy commissioner.
Mojaheed's brother and Nayeb-e-Ameer of Faridpur municipality Ali Afjol Md Khalech led the namaz-e-janaza.
Reaching the village along with other members of the family, Mojaheed's elder son Ali Ahmad Tajdid said his father had pardoned those who testified against him in court and asked his family members not to be angry with them.
Ameer of Faridpur district Jamaat-e-Islami Abdu Tawab said the burial and janaza had been completed with the assistance of the security forces.
He, however, claimed many people had been barred from attending the janaza.
Members of the Rapid Action Battalion and police created a security shield around Mojaheed's home and burial spot to avert any untoward situation.
Meanwhile, Faridpur district Awami League brought out a procession hailing the execution of Mojaheed. They also distributed sweets among people.
After the burial, the war criminal's younger son, Ali Ahmed Mabruur, reiterated that his father had not filed any mercy petition. To humiliate his father, the government staged the drama, he added.
The war criminals, both former ministers, were hanged simultaneously at 12:55am yesterday at Dhaka Central Jail after President Abdul Hamid rejected their mercy pleas.

petitions before forwarding them for next course of action," he told The Daily Star.
Talking to reporters at the Secretariat earlier in the day, Anisul said the law ministry forwarded the petitions to the president through the prime minister. The president then rejected them in accordance with the law and the constitution.
He said Mojaheed and Salauddin appealed to the president and begged for their lives as per Article 49 of the constitution.
The article says: "The president shall have power to grant pardons, reprieves and respites and to remit, suspend or

commute any sentence passed by any court, tribunal or other authority."
Replying to a question, the minister said it is the president who is to decide whether the contents of the mercy petitions will be disclosed.
The death sentences of Mojaheed and Salauddin, who belonged to the Jamaat and the BNP, were executed in line with all relevant rules and procedures, he added.
He also said there was no foreign pressure on the government over the hangings. "There was nothing illegal or no violation of any law in executing their death sentences."
Yesterday, Home Minister Asaduzzaman Khan Kamal also said

the war criminals had appealed to the president under Article 49 of the constitution to save their lives.
"Their family members did not see the applications. But we have all the documents," he said while talking to reporters at his office.
"We went through the required process after they sought mercy," he added.
Mojaheed and Salauddin were hanged together at the same time at 12:55am yesterday.
The previous day, the law minister confirmed that the two had sought presidential clemency. However, their family members claimed that they didn't ask for mercy.

aspirants as councillor and member aspirants will not be able to contest under political party banner.
Earlier on November 19, the House passed the local government (municipality) amendment bill allowing elections only to the mayoral post under political party banner.
Previously, political parties could not nominate any candidates in local government body polls. They could only extend their support to a particular candidate.
But in practice local units of political parties were put to work for such candidates. The parties' participation was therefore all but official, said ministry sources.
In all of the three original bills, there were provisions of holding elections at all the posts of city corporation, upazila parishad and union parishad under political banner.
But during scrutiny the parliamentary standing committee on LGRD ministry recommended holding elections to the mayoral post at city corporation level and to the chairman post at upazila parishad and union parishad levels on party line.

Video footage of the area shot on Saturday shows men carrying several bodies slung in blankets watched by a crowd of local people in a dusty plain near the village of Sai Tung.
Nilar Myint an official from the local administrative authorities in Hpakan told AFP that rescue teams have so far found 97 people killed in the landslide.
Rescue operations continue with the Myanmar Red Cross, army, police and local community groups, but officials say they have little hope of pulling people alive from the rubble.
She added that because the men were mostly migrant workers from different parts of the country, authorities were struggling to identify any of those killed.
Myanmar is the source of virtually all of the world's finest jadeite, a near translucent green stone that is prized above almost all other materials in neighbouring China.
Landslides are a common hazard in Hpakan as prospectors pick their way across perilous mounds, often under cover of darkness, driven by the hope that they might find a chunk of jade that would deliver them from poverty.

Within half an hour of the execution at 12:55am yesterday, Jamaat announced a two-day programme, including the daylong shutdown in protest of "the killing".
The primary and mass education ministry has meanwhile postponed today's primary and ebtdai terminal examinations and rescheduled it for November 30 at 11:00am.
In a press release, Rabindranath Roy, public relations officer of the ministry, however said the decision was made due to "unavoidable reason".

The terminal exams for class-V students began yesterday across the country with more than 32 lakh students taking part.
The tests, dubbed as the largest public examination in the country, were scheduled to end on November 29.
Of the total examinees, more than 29.49 lakh students of primary schools would take the test, while around 3 lakh students of madrasas would sit for the ebtdai exam.
On November 19, Jamaat observed a hartal as the Supreme Court dismissed Mojaheed's review petition on the verdict that upheld his death

sentence.
BNP standing committee member Salauddin Quader Chowdhury was also hanged along with Mojaheed, but his party did not announce any protest programme.
Contacted, BNP leaders ruled out any possibility to extend support to the Jamaat hartal.
Additional security measures have been taken in the capital ahead of today's hartal. Thirteen battalions of Border Guard Bangladesh were deployed for around 12 hours since 6:30 yesterday evening to maintain law and order.

humanity and war crimes in 1971.
Earlier, the SC upheld the death penalties of Jamaat leaders Abdul Quader Mollah and Muhammad Kamaruzzaman for their wartime offences. Mollah was executed on December 12, 2013, and Kamaruzzaman on April 11 this

year.
The SC on September 17 last year commuted the death penalty of Jamaat leader Delawar Hossain Sayedee and sentenced him to imprisonment until death.
Mahbubey said his office would move a review petition before the Appellate Division seeking to rein-

state the death penalty for Sayedee after the SC releases the full text of the judgment that commuted his sentence.
The SC verdicts on Mojaheed, Salauddin, Kamaruzzaman, and Quader Mollah had satisfied family members of the war crimes victims, justice seekers, war crimes trial

campaigners, state counsels, and investigators, but the judgement on Sayedee has frustrated them.
The convicts' families, defence counsels, and the party they belong to were dissatisfied with the trials and verdicts and pointed to controversies.

toled The Daily Star that in spite of some controversies and shortcomings, the war crimes tribunals have certainly worked well.
The accused war criminals had received adequate opportunities to present their cases and the trials have been conducted and completed well, he said.
"I strongly feel that most of the international criticisms are unfair."
Khurshid Alam Khan, an SC lawyer and editor of Dhaka Law reports, told The Daily Star that the war crimes trials were fair despite controversies.
War crimes were different from other crimes and there was no need for eyewitnesses, he said, adding that the documentary evidence was enough for holding such trials.
After the International Crimes Tribunal-2 sentenced Sayedee to death in 2013, activists of Jamaat and pro-Jamaat student body Islami Chhatra Shibir resorted to violence that left 65 people dead and several hundred injured in just one week.
International Crimes Tribunal-1 chairman Justice Md Nizamul Huq resigned on December 11, 2012, following the "leaked Skype conversation between him and expatriate legal expert Ahmed Ziauddin".
Bangla daily Amar Desh also published "transcripts of the Skype conversation of Justice Huq with Ahmed Ziauddin".
