Clash over football match leaves 15 hurt in Meherpur

At least 15 people were injured as people of two villages clashed over a football match at Govipur Sadar upazila yesterday.

Meherpur Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP) said two teams—one from Govipur and the other from Shalika village took part in a friendly football match at Guchchhagram playground at Govipur on Monday.

At one stage, the match was postponed following an altercation between the supporters of the two villages over a decision by the match referee. As a sequel to that, people of Govipur beat up a rickshaw-puller from Shalika while he was passing through the village around 10:30am. Hearing the news, people of Shalika, quipped with lethal weapons, attacked Govipur village, triggering a

clash between the people of the two villages that left 15 from both sides injured. People of Shalika also damaged huge aman crop owned by the Govipur villagers. On information, police rushed to the spot and fired 12 blank shots to bring the situation under control, the ASP added. The injured are taking treatment secretly at different clinics and nearby upazila hospitals to avoid arrest, Meherpur Superintendent of Police Hamidul Alam said.

At least 10 people were injured in a clash between two associate bodies of the ruling Awami League in Bandarbarazar City Super Market in Sylhet city on Monday evening, reports our Moulvibazar correspondent. Witnesses said the district and city units of Swachchhasebok League brought out a joint procession, protesting the day-long hartal enforced by Jamaat-e-Islami. When the procession reached in front of Bandarbarazar City Super Market, supporters of the two groups locked in a clash over taking place in the front row of the procession, leaving 10 people from both sides injured. Police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control.

Physically challenged youth tortured on theft charge

A physically challenged youth was brutally tortured on theft charge at a local bus terminal in the district town early Monday.

He sustained severe burn injuries as the torturers scalded him with burning polythene bags.

The victim is Salauddin, son of Safique Ullah of Rasulpur village in Sadar upazila of the district.

Police and family sources said when Salauddin was returning home from the bus terminal after coming from Feni, some young men caught him around 2:00am suspecting him to be a thief. They tied him to a tree and tortured him. Later, the attackers left him by the road with his hands and legs tied.

Informed by locals, his family members rescued him and took him to Sadar Hospital in a critical condition.

Meanwhile, victim's brother Moin Uddin filed a case against 25 unidentified people with Sadar Police Station.

35 BNP-Jamaat men among 120 arrested in 4 districts

At least 120 people, including 35 BNP and Jamaat-Shibir men, were held during special drives by law enforcers in Jhenidah, Chittagong, Chapainawabganj and Satkhira districts yesterday and the day before.

A joint force in separate drives arrested five activists of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student wing Islami Chhatra Shibir in three upazilas of Jhenidah in the last two days, reports our correspondent.

Of them, three are from Sadar upazila and two others from Harinakundo and Kotchandpur upazilas respectively.

They were arrested on charge of planning subversive activities in the areas,

said Assistant Superintendent of Police Ajbahar Ali Sheikh.

In Chittagong, police arrested at least 86 people, including three Jamaat-Shibir men, in different upazilas and the city yesterday, reports our correspondent.

Of the arrestees, two Jamaat activists from Satkania upazila and one Shibir man from Mirsarai upazila.

They were arrested in several cases, said Naimul Islam, additional superintendent of police.

According to our Chapainawabganj correspondent, the law enforcers arrested at least 29 people, including three BNP and Jamaat men, in different upazilas of the district yesterday and the day before.

They were arrested in several cases, according to the control room of SP's office.

Of the arrestees, two BNP men and one Jamaat activist are from Shibganj upazila.

Away in Satkhira, a team of joint force in separate drives arrested 30 people, including 24 Jamaat-Shibir activists, from six upazilas in the district in the last two days on various charges, reports UNB.

Of them, the law enforcers arrested 24 Jamaat-Shibir activists from Tianshi area in Sadar upazila while they were holding a secret meeting there.

The law enforcers also recovered four hand bombs and a number of jihadi books from the spot.
