## Parking narrows road beside MMCH gate

Commuters, patients suffer as private ambulances do the illegal practice

Private ambulances parked on both sides of the main entrance of Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) often occupy a good portion of the four-lane highway at Charpara of the town, adding to traffic jam in the busy area.

The illegal practice, continuing for years, results in sufferings for thousands of commuters, patients, and their attendants, but the authorities concerned have failed to take any effective step, it is alleged.

During a visit to MMCH on Sunday, this correspon-

dent found some 50 ambulances kept on the two sides of MMCH's main gate, creating obstruction to easy access, especially for patients.

Besides, the ambulance drivers and their brokers often move around in the emergency department area of the hospital to get trips, creating disturbance to the normal activities there, said hospital sources.

Talking to this correspondent, many outdoor and indoor patients said they face difficulties due to illegal parking of private ambulances.

There are allegations that ambulance drivers enjoy the

illegal parking facility with blessings from a section of hospital staff and on-duty policemen.

Earlier, private ambulance drivers used to keep the vehicles on the MMCH premises but recently the authorities took action, preventing the vehicles' unauthorised stay inside.

But the unscrupulous ambulance drivers have continued parking beside the hospital gate, occupying a good portion of the road.

Contacted, MMCH Director Brig Gen Nasir Uddin Ahamed, who joined there recently, said, "I have already stopped parking of private ambulances on

MMCH campus. I have also initiated a step to clean up the hospital premises and its adjacent areas so that service to the patients is not disturbed."

Dr Motiur Rahman Bhuiyan, vice-principal of Mymensingh Medical College, said they urged the authorities concerned on several occasions to take steps to prevent private ambulances' illegal parking beside the hospital gate but to no effect yet.

Md Kamrul Islam, officer-in-charge of Kotwali Police Station, said illegal parking of private ambulances at the important place will be stopped soon.

## SERIAL BLASTS 2 JMB men get life, another 10 yrs jail in Lalmonirhat

A court here yesterday sentenced three members of banned militant outfit Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) to different jail terms in connection with August 17 series bomb blasts case.

Of the convicts, Mostafizur Rahman Mosta alias Sumon, son of Shamsur Ali of Bairati village under Kaliganj upazila in the district, and Moniruzzaman Iqbal alias Selim, son of Jabdul Islam of Kashoya village in Thakurgaon, were awarded life term while Sadequul Islam alias Sadique, son of Daud Uddin of Devinagar village in Naogaon district, was jailed for 10 years.

Judge Miah Muhammad Ali Akbar Azizi of the District and Sessions Judge's Court also fined them Tk 5,000 each. In default, they are to suffer another six months in jail.

Of the three, Sadique was tried in absentia, said police.

On August 17, 2005, the trio simultaneously blasted bombs in different parts of the district town, including the court and DC office areas.

## 20 held while going to India illegally

## FORMER ENCLAVES

# 105 more go to India

As part of the ongoing process to relocate former enclave dwellers, 105 people of two erstwhile enclaves -- Doikhata in Sadar upazila and Dahala Khagrabari in Debiganj upazila -- in Panchagarh district went to India yesterday.

In the forth batch, 105 people of 21 families got together at the ground of Debiganj Degree College and started their journey with goods by three buses and five trucks to Chilahati-Haldibari border check post in Domar upazila of Nilphamari district in the afternoon.

A touching scene

emerged at the college ground when the vehicles carrying the people started for India.

Kousola Rani, 24, wife of Nilu Chandra Roy of Brodreswary village in Boda upazila, broke into tears and rolled at the ground as her parents and brothers of Doikhata former enclave left for India.

"I have become orphan from today although my parents are alive. As I got married in Bangladesh, I have to live here", she said.

After completion of all formalities, Additional Deputy Magistrate (ADM) Golam Azam formally handed over the 105 people to First Secretary of Indian High Commission of

Bangladesh Rama Kanta Gupta at checking and loading point at the college ground around 9:00am. UNO Shafiqul Islam was present there.

After completing immigration at the check post, they entered India around 1:00pm. The India-bound people were bidden goodbye with sweets, flowers and gifts before crossing the border.

Block Development Officer of Haldibari in Cooch Behar district, West Bengal, Taposh Kumar Roy officially received the people at the entry point of the border in the afternoon while Forest Minister of West Bengal Binoy Kumar welcomed them.

## Land disputes leave one dead, 100 hurt

A man was killed and at least 100 others were injured over land disputes in Nabiganj and Sadar upazilas of Habiganj district yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Iqbal Miah, 25, son of Angur Miah of Naharpur village in Nabiganj upazila. He was former organising secretary Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) Nabiganj municipality unit.

Police said there was a dispute between Iqbal and his cousin Delwar Hosain over the ownership of a land. Both locked in an altercation over the issue at around 2:00pm. At one stage, Delwar hit Iqbal on the head with an iron rod, leaving him dead on the spot. Delwar went into hiding soon after the incident.

Contacted, officer-in-charge Mulla Monir Hosain of Nabiganj Police Station said law enforcers have

already launched a drive to arrest Delwar.

In Sadar upazila, at least 100 people were injured in a clash between two groups of people over a disputed land at Katakali village the same day.

Locals and police said there had been a longstanding dispute between Mokhesur Rahman, 45, Yasin Ullah, 52, of the village over the ownership of a land.

The clash ensued at around 11:00am when the supporters of the two went to the land to capture it. They attacked each other with lethal weapons, leaving at least 100 people from both sides injured.

Being informed, police went to the spot and fired 13 rounds of rubber bullets to disperse the clashing groups. Of the injured, 64 were admitted to Habiganj Sadar Hospital and private clinics while the rest given first aid.

## ACID ATTACK ON HOUSEWIFE

# Four accused held after 2 months

Following a directive from the High Court (HC) on Tuesday, law enforcers in separate drives early Wednesday arrested four people in connection with a case filed for hurling acid on a housewife in Kachua upazila on October 2 this year.

The arrestees are Saddam Hossain Russel, 26, Babul, 32, Alauddin, 35, and Shahin, 26, of Tulpai village in the upazila. Three other accused in the case-- Shahin, 28, Sabuj, 23, and Liton, 28--are still on the run.

In response to a writ petition filed by the victim's husband on November 22, the HC on Tuesday directed police to arrest the culprits, who threw acid on Nazma Begum, 28, in 72 hours, and to submit a report before it in two weeks after

complying with the order.

According to the case statement, a gang of 6/7 criminals threw acid on Nazma at Tulpai village when she went out of their room to respond to the call of nature around 10:00pm on October 2.

The following day, Nazma's husband Ismail Hossain filed a case with Kachua Police Station accusing seven people, including Russel, under the Acid Control Act-2002.

But due to unknown reason, police failed to arrest any of the accused, who are reportedly very influential.

Sub-inspector Mosharraf Hossain of Chandpur Court Police said the arrestees were produced before the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate's Court yesterday noon.

Judge Md Kaiser Mossarraf Yousuf cancelled their bail prayer and sent them to jail.
