North South University (NSU), the first private university in Bangladesh, was established in 1992 by a group of eminent industrialists, prominent patrons of education, notable philanthropists, veteran academics and senior civil servants of the country. In the early 1990s, they had a dream to set up a world class university as a center of excellence in higher education in the private sector. Their dedication, tireless efforts and hard work paved the way for approval of the establishment of NSU.

NSU is modeled on universities in the USA and follows their academic features. It has an International Advisory Board, comprising scholars from all over the world, to counsel and to suggest improvements on academic matters from time to time. NSU has also collaboration agreements with a good number of reputable universities around the world. All faculty members of NSU are educated in, and experienced with North American or equivalent universities. There are a good number of foreign faculty members at NSU who enrich the academic environment. There are also many international students from different countries studying at NSU. Presently, NSU is pursuing program wise, as well as institutional accreditation from reputable accrediting bodies in the USA.

The Computer Science & Engineering Programs are also under the process for accreditation by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET), USA. The University is preparing for accreditation of the Public Policy & Governance Program by the Network of Schools of Public Policy, Affairs and Administration (NASPAA). Similarly, the Public Health Program is preparing for accreditation by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH). NSU has also started the ground works of its institutional accreditation.
