# World agrees landmark deal

All countries for the first time commit to cut emissions

A deal to attempt to limit the rise in global temperatures to less than 2C has been agreed at the climate change summit in Paris after two weeks of negotiations.

The pact is the first to commit all countries to cut carbon emissions. The agreement is partly legally

binding and partly voluntary. Earlier, key blocs, including

the G77 group of developing countries, and nations such as China and India said they supported the proposals.

President of the UN climate conference of parties (COP) and French Foreign Minister Laurent Fabius said: "I now invite the COP to adopt the decision entitled Paris Agreement outlined in the document.

"Looking out to the room I see that the reaction is positive, I see no objections. The Paris agreement is adopted."

As he struck the gavel to signal the adoption of the deal, delegates rose to their feet cheering and applauding.

Nearly 200 countries have been attempting to strike the first climate deal to commit all countries to cut emissions, which would come into being in 2020.

US President Obama was among the first world leaders to tweet his congratulations, describing the deal as "huge".

The chairman of the group representing

some of the world's poorest countries called the deal historic, adding, "We are living in unprecedented times, which call for unprecedented measures.

"It is the best outcome we could have hoped for, not just for the Least Developed Countries, but for all citizens of the world."

COP21-CMP11 The measures in the agreement included reviewing progress every five years, and \$100 billion a year in climate

finance for developing countries by 2020. Ahead of the deal being struck, delegates

were in a buoyant mood as they gathered in the hall waiting for the plenary session to resume. Fabius was applauded as he entered the

hall ahead of the announcement. Earlier, French President Francois Hollande called the proposals unprecedented, while UN Secretary General Ban Kimoon called on nego-

tiators to "finish the job". However, the celebratory mood has not been shared among all observers.

Nick Dearden, director of campaign group Global Justice Now, said, "It's outrageous that the deal that's on the table is being spun as a success when it undermines the rights of the world's most vulnerable communities and has almost nothing binding to ensure a safe and liveable climate for future generations."

## AL, BNP in last-ditch efforts to stop rebels

Both the Awami League and the BNP are making frantic efforts at the eleventh hour to convince their rebel candidates to quit their municipal bids as the deadline for nomination withdrawal expires today.

In the 235 municipalities that go to polls on December 30, the AL has about 25 rebel mayor candidates and the BNP at least 26.

The AL had originally 52 rebels, but after a 24hour ultimatum from the party high-ups, about half of them have either pulled out or will do so today,

party sources said.

Some, however, resigned from the party to run in the polls.

After today, the AL will try to persuade its rebels to publicly announce their support for the party-backed candidates. However, AL rebels at different places

say they will not back off as they are "more popular" than the party candidates.


"Things had been the same in the last municipal election in 2011. The party did not support me, but I contested as an independent candidate and won. I SEE PAGE 10 COL 4
