Case not ready for trial in two years

Families of murder victims worried as main accused still scot-free, attends workplace

Families of the four people killed by Jamaat-BNP activists in an attack on the motorcade of lawmaker Asaduzzaman Noor at Ramganj Haat of Tupamari union in Nilphamari Sadar upazila have expressed worry as the case for the brutal incident is yet to be ready for trial in two years.

Meanwhile, the prime accused of the case has remained scot-free.

Jamaat-BNP men on night of December 12 in 2013 set fire to 200-250 houses of Hindu families in Polashbari, Tronibari, Laxmichap, Beltoli and Kachhari villages in Sadar upazila, looted valuables and injured many with sharp weapons, apparently to vent out wrath after the execution of Abdul Kader Molla, Jamaat's assistant secretary general, for crimes against humanity.

The then Awami League (AL) lawmaker Asaduzzaman Noor (now also minister for cultural affairs) reached Nilphamari from Dhaka, and went to the villages with a motorcade on 14 December morning.

In the afternoon, when Noorwith his entourage came to Ramganj Haat on the way to Nilphamari town, several hundred Jamaat-BNP men equipped with sharp weapons attacked them, leaving killed four people -- Khorshed Alam, president of Tupamari union unit of Kishok League, Farhad Hossen, office secretary of union Jubo League, and activists Murad Hossen and Lebu Mia.

Around 70-80 motorbikes of AL activists were either burnt or looted during the incident.

Man killed over land dispute

A farmer was killed and 14 others were injured in a clash between two groups of villagers over land dispute at Jhirakhali village in Dhubaura upazila of the district yesterday morning. The victim was identified

as Yasin Ali, 30, son of late Abdul Ali of the village.

Quoting locals, police said there had been a longstanding dispute between Yasin and Md Rokonuzzaman of neighbouring Batihala village over the ownership of nine acres of land.

As Rokonuzzaman and his men went to the disputed land around 11:30am, Yasin and his supporters swooped on their rivals, leaving at least 15 people from both sides

The injured were admitted to Dhubaura Upazila Health Complex and later shifted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) as their condition deteriorated. Yeasin died on way to MMCH, police said.

Nation recalls martyrdom of Bir Shreshtha Jahangir today

Today is the 44th death anniversary of Bir Shreshtha Captain Mohiuddin Jahangir, one of the seven greatest heroes of the 1971 Liberation War. On this day in 1971, just

two days before the nation's final victory against the Pakistani occupation army, Captain Mohiuddin Jahangir embraced martyrdom in a battle with the Pakistani occupation forces at Rehaichar in the district town. Mohiuddin Jahangir was born on March 6,

under Babuganj upazila in Barisal district. On October 5, 1967 he joined the armed forces as a cadet at the Pakistan Military Academy. After successfully completing his training with the 15th war course, Jahangir

Corps of Engineers. In 1971 Mohiuddin Jahangir was working at the construction field at

was commissioned in the



Captain Mohiuddin Jahangir Karakoram. On June 10, he

took a few days leave and left for the Sialkot border to reach India. He managed to cross the border safely and joined the Liberation War at Mehdipur under Maldah district in then West Bengal. On July 3, he became a


captain of sector 7. He was given the responsibility to fight in Chapainawabganj border area. On December 10, 1971,

Captain Jahangir along with 50 freedom fighters crossed the Mohananda River and engaged in a fight against Pakistan army.

The freedom fighters took positionnearRehaicharMoholla in Chapainawabganj town on December 13. On the following day, Jahangir went ahead of the defenseline and charged grenade into a trench of Pakistan occupation army. Hit by a bullet from Pak army, the valiant freedom fighter died on the spot.

The next day, he was buried near the graveyard of another valiant freedom fighter, Major Najmul Haque on the premises of Sonamasjid in presence of Commander of Sector 7 Lt Col Kazi Nuruzzaman, other freedom fighters and local Awami League leaders.

MURDER OF MEHERPUR SCHOOL KID ANTAR

Locals demand arrest, capital punishment of the killer

Several thousand villagers took out a procession and then formed a human chain beside the Kushtia-Meherpur highway yesterday, demanding arrest and capital punishment of the killer of schoolboy Antar Mahmud in Gangni upazila of Meherpur district.

The protesters also gave an ultimatum to the authorities to book the killer within 36hours. They said tougher agitation will be launched if the killer is not arrested by then.

President of Mothmura union unit of Awami League Abul Hashem, general secretary of the unit Abdul Bari and social workers Moniruzzaman Atu and Sahabul Islam spoke at the programme.

Seven-year-old Antar Mahmud was killed

allegedly by his neighbour Sabuj Ali at Baot village under Mothmura union in the upazila on Thursday night.

Antar was a second-grader at Baot Government Primary School and son of Kafirul Islam, an expatriate in the KSA. Locals found Antar in a jute sack in a

classroom of the school with his hands and legs tied and a gag in his mouth around three hours after he had gone missing from a playground in the village, Gangni police said.

Sabuj Ali, 19, who is an accused in several criminal cases, including mugging, might have committed the crime, Akram Hossain, officer-in-charge (OC) of Gangni Police Station, said, adding that they are trying to unearth clue to the murder.
