Swechchhasebak League and other Association organised a three-day photo exhibition titled "Road to Independence 1971".



Tripura yesterday celebrated Bangladesh's Victory Day commemorating the heroic Indian Army soldiers who laid down their lives in the 1971 Liberation War.
