Rab rescues girl from attempted forced prostitution, one held

Rapid Action Battalion (Rab-7) rescued a teenage girl from attempted forced prostitution in Chandgaon area of Chittagong city yesterday, and arrested a woman in this connection.

Two youths who were previously acquainted with the girl, 14, brought her to the city from Chakaria upazila of Cox's Bazar on August 3 and handed her over to the woman, Rab-7 officials said. The woman kept her captive in her house for around four months and forcefully tried to engage her in prostitution, said the offi-

'Yaba hauling' journo, wife sent to jail

A Chittagong court yesterday sent to jail a Gazi TV journalist and his wife who were arrested with 40,000 Yaba tablets on Monday.

The Department of Narcotics Control arrested Mohammad Selim, Cox's Bazar correspondent of the television channel, and his wife Khaleda Akhter Munni with the tablets in the city's Firingi Bazar area. They were transporting the drug to Dhaka from Cox's Bazar in a rented microbus with two stickers saying "Gtv" and "Press" pasted on its front and back.

130 shanties gutted in N'ganj, Dhaka

Around 130 shanties were gutted in fires in Narayanganj and Dhaka yesterday.

In Narayanganj Sadar, a fire gutted over 100 shanties in Chandmari slum area last night. Four fire fighting units doused the blaze in an hour, said fire station sources. The reason behind the fire could not be ascertained immediately, nor if there was any casualty.

In Dhaka, a fire gutted 30 shanties in Madhya Badda early yesterday. The fire department said it might have originated from an electric short circuit, adding that it took them two hours to douse the blaze. No casualty was reported.

2 fatally run over by train in Tangail

Two teenage boys were killed and another was injured as a train ran them over in Analiabari area of Kalihati upazila in Tangail yesterday.

The deceased were Babu Miah, 14, and Al Amin, 18, of Chapainawabganj Sadar. Injured Mohammad Nayeem, 16, is undergoing treatment at Tangail Medical College Hospital. The boys who were cousins were walking on the rail track when the train crushed them under its wheels, said police.
