What do you tell yourself before stepping on to the stage?

I usually try to think about my character, who I am, where I am coming from, etc, as well as the backstory of the play and the role of my character. I also concentrate on the very first thing that I am going to do on stage. I keep on repeating it to myself, and have found that it helps me to concentrate.

What are three of your favourite productions that you have been a part

Aroj Charitammrito, Dui Je Chhilo Ek Chakor, and Bonduk Juddho – all stage plays, and all 3 are special in some way.

What advice would you give to young aspiring actors?

Have the desire to be the best in what you do. Don't settle for mediocrity.
