Accusing Bangladesh's political parties of failing to nurture the Liberation War's spirit, speakers at a convention in the capital yesterday called for "introducing political freedom" to build the country based on the spirit.

"Even 44 years past the victory in the Liberation War, we have not been liberated," said Jatiya Samajtantrik Dal (JSD-Rob) President ASM Abdur

Political parties talk about the development of the state, human rights and secularism but "they could not ensure employment for people", he added. Criticising the government, he said, "We can not accept the victory which was achieved robbing people's right to vote."

Andolon, a platform stating to be based on Serajul Alam Khan's ideologies, organised its "First Central Representative Convention" at the Institution of Engineers, Bangladesh. Gonoshasthaya Kendra

founder Zafrullah Chowdhury said the state failed to ensure low cost treatment for people. "If the government was pro-people, price of medicine would have been cheaper," he said.

He also criticised the government for providing transit facilities, saying India was "trying to expand its domination over Bangladesh in the name of helping Tripura"

The platform President Sarup Hasan Shaheen said Bangladesh was waiting for a new form of politics based on political and social needs, and was being run with laws of the British colonial period which was giving birth to "bad politics".

Dhaka city dwellers start Four die in road feeling pinch of winter

Even of late, the Dhaka city dwellers have started feeling the pinch of winter and its intensity is likely to rise further across the country from Saturday, according to Bangladesh Meteorological Department.

"As the country is not getting enough sunlight during daytime, the mercury is falling fast," meteorologist Hafizur Rahman told the news agency yesterday evening.

Winter has started setting in as the the capital experienced a sudden rainfall on Thursday night.

With the fall in temperature, traders of warm clothes are doing a good business with middle-income people crowding their stalls and shops. But, financially insolvent and homeless people who cannot afford to buy warm clothes are feeling the double pinch of winter.

The lowest temperature in Dhaka yesterday was 15 degrees Celsius.

Hafizur Rahman said a mild cold wave may start sweeping over Rangpur division and parts of Dhaka, Rajshahi, Khulna and Sylhet divisions from Saturday.

Usually, winter starts in Bangladesh in November, but it set in late this time. This year, he said, the temperature in December was higher compared to previous years.


