



## DILIP KUMAR HONoured with Padma Vibhushan

Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh and Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis visited Indian Cinema's legendary actor Dilip Kumar at his residence to honour him with the Padma Vibhushan award.

The announcement to honour Dilip Kumar, Amitabh Bachchan and a few others with Padma Vibhushan was made by the government on the eve of Republic Day on January 25, 2015. However, the acting legend could not attend the special function held in Rashtrapati

Bhavan in April when other Padma awardees were honoured by President Pranab Mukherjee.

Kumar's nuanced performances and his dedication to the craft has been an inspiration for generations of actors.
