Cybercrime training, investigation centres by March next year

Country's first-ever Cybercrime Training Centre and Cybercrime Investigation Centre will start operating in full swing by upcoming March as 99 percent of the work have already been completed, Project Director and CID's Police Super of Dhaka Metro (North) Rezaul Hawlader said yesterday.

Both the centres are being constructed at a cost of US \$3.5 million (around Tk 28 crore) under the project of Enhancing Cyber Investigation Capacity of Bangladesh Police, he added.

The government contributed around Tk 4.5 crore while Koica gave the rest of the money. The investigation centre has been built at the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) headquarters in the capital while the cyber training centre is housed in the Traffic and Driving School in Mill Barack of the old part of the city. Most of the equipment have been purchased from Korea and the United States, and some others from Germany. Six CID officers, including a computer programmer, with posts equivalent to additional police supers, two assistant police supers, and three subinspectors have already been trained in a Korean university for six months. The trained CID officers and two computer experts from Korea will train others, and now they are preparing a syllabus suitable for Bangladesh.

Over the last two decades, overall literacy attainment of the population increased while there has been a number of achievements in the primary education sector, revealed a Campaign for Popular Education (Campe) report yesterday afternoon.

In 2000, 58 percent of households had at least one literate person, which in 2013 increased to 81.4 percent, according to the report.

Enrollment rate, attendance, and competencies of students increased while both the dropout rate and total number of out-ofschool children decreased, showed the study, "Education Watch 2015, Moving from MDG to SDG, Accelerate progress for Quality Primary Education".

tify trends in the primary education sector documented by various Education Watch studies carried out during 1999-2015. Data of five previous studies carried out

in 1998, 2000, 2005, 2008, and 2013 were used along with surveys in 663 primary education institutions, including government, newly nationalised and non-formal ones, ebtedai madrasas and kindergartens in 2014.

Tests on 27 types of competencies were teachers. carried out on 5,375 students in 309 primary education institutions and the results were presented by Samir Ranjan Nath, principal researcher of the study.

sharing findings of a study, "The Dalit communities living in railway colonies/lands in northern part of Bangladesh". She said there were fears that the Dalits would be

deprived of their "traditional livelihood." In the study, Prof Ainoon recommended tackling of corruption and bribery in railway and other public offices to protect their livelihoods and accommodation rights.

Articles 27, 28 and 29 of the constitution clearly state that the law and fundamental policy of the state do not support any form of discrimination against any citizen based on their religion, race, caste, sex or place of birth or profession, but in reality the Dalits are being discriminated

against and denied their rights and opportunities, she said. Speaking as chief guest, lawmaker Shirin Akhtar stressed the need for a coordinated initiative to bring the deprivations of the Dalits to the attention of policy-makers. Anik Asad, country director of HEKS, a Swiss development organisation; Aroma Dutta, member of the National Human Rights Commission, and Prof Dr Mostafa Hasan of Jagannath University also took part in the discussion. 3 Japanese GIAHS Ayu of the Nagara River System in Gifu

The sustainable inland fisheries of a specific type of fish (Ayu) benefit from clean waters of the Nagara River which are maintained through upstream forest management. Local communities have lived within this linked ecosystem and have developed their liveli-

By permitting the production of a diverse range of products, the system ensures stable livelihoods and makes communities more resilient to disasters.

Takachihogo-Shiibayama Mountainous Agriculture and Forestry System in Miyazaki

This site is located in a steep mountainous area where flat land is extremely scarce. In this severe environment, local people have established a distinctive and sustainable system of agriculture and forestry, which balances timber production with diverse farming activities -- such as terraced rice growing, shiitake mushroom cultivation, beef cattle raising, or tea cultivation. The forest is maintained as a "mosaic" of conifers and broadleaf trees using traditional practices.
