Pep leaving Bayern

Ancelotti to step in; Pep linked with City

Pep Guardiola will leave Bayern Munich as head coach at the end of the season and be replaced by Carlo Ancelotti, club chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge confirmed on Sunday.

Guardiola flew home to Spain on Sunday to be with his family for Christmas and has given no indication of his future plans, having been heavily linked to Manchester City.

He will return in January when the Bavarian giants fly to Doha for a training camp before the season resumes on January 22 when they play Hamburg away.

"We appreciate everything Guardiola gave to our club and hope to celebrate a lot of success this season, especially as we now know he is leaving," Rummenigge said in a club statement.

"Carlo Ancelotti has had a lot of success as coach and has won the Champions League three times.

"He is a calm, balanced professional who can deal with stars and lets you play a flexible style of football -- we have found what we were looking for.

"With Ancelotti, we have a new, successful trainer for Bayern. We are looking

"As I learnt that they were interested in me, any other team was out of the question.

"I want to wish my friend Pep Guardiola and Bayern Munich all the best for the rest of the season."

Ancelotti will inherit a star-studded

squad, although he admitted in October that he does not enjoy watching Bayern play given their domination of Germany's top flight.

"Bayern will win the Bundesliga [this season] without even taking their hands out of their pockets," said the Italian.

"I must confess that I cannot enjoy watching Bayern's games.

"There's just not enough competition for them."

Having joined Bayern in 2013 to much fanfare, Guardiola has so far won five trophies with the Bavarian giants, giving him a career total of 19 as coach following his 14 in four years from 2008-2012 at Barcelona.

A Thomas Mueller penalty on Saturday sealed Bayern's 1-0 win at Hanover 96 which left the German league leaders eight points clear in the table and on course to become the first club to win a fourth straight Bundesliga.

Guardiola's side are still in the hunt for a repeat of their 2013 treble of Champions League, Bundesliga and German Cup, and will face last season's finalists Juventus in the last 16 of Europe's premier club competition.

Guardiola's tenure at Bayern is likely to be judged on his Champions League form as he bids to reach the final in Milan on May 28 having exited at the semi-final stage the last two seasons.

Despite winning the Champions League in 2009 and 2011 with Barcelona he has so far failed to bring Europe's top domestic

Juve win 7th successive game

Mario Mandzukic hit his first Juventus brace and Paul Pogba added a third as the Serie A champions ended the year with a patchy 3-2 win over struggling Carpi yesterday.

Massimiliano Allegri's men travelled to Modena, Carpi's temporary home, looking to make it seven wins from their past seven league outings and succeeded.

The visitors were stunned on the quarter hour when Marco Borriello turned Leonardo Bonucci in the Juventus area to beat Gianluigi Buffon down low.

Mandzukic's brace gave the Turin giants a 2-1 lead at the break and the impressive Pogba allowed the champions to breathe easy with a well-taken third five minutes into the second half.

But Juve almost paid for a momentary lapse of concentration when Carpi came fighting back, prompting a fit of rage from Allegri on the touchlines.

The hosts were given faint hope when Bonucci turned into his own net to reduce the arrears in injury time, but Lorenzo Lollo spurned a great chance for a dramatic equaliser moments later but Juve held on for a 10th win of the campaign that moved the champions up to second place at three points behind leaders Inter Milan.

Barca on top of the world

Lionel Messi marked his return from illness with a brilliant goal as Barcelona beat Argentina's River Plate 3-0 to capture a record third Club World Cup on Sunday.

The Spanish giants welcomed back Messi after a bout of kidney stones and the mercurial Argentine scored with a clinical finish on 36 minutes, before a lethal Luis Suarez double destroyed River's hopes.

"We came here to win the title and it was important to get the job done," said Suarez.

"We stayed calm and played our game until Leo scored the first goal. More than my goals, it was just important to get our hands on the trophy."

Neymar, himself returning to the side after a groin strain, was instrumental in Barcelona's opener, climbing to knock down a Dani Alves cross for Messi to steer past River goalkeeper Marcelo Barovero with a deft flick of his left boot.

Suarez, who scored a hat-trick in Barca's 3-0 semi-final win over Guangzhou Evergrande, scored a second with a fierce low drive four minutes into the second half.

The former Liverpool striker grabbed his fifth goal in Japan when he guided a thumping header past Barovero after a

pinpoint cross from Neymar.

Barca goalkeeper Claudio Bravo was a spectator for much of the game on a cold night. But the Chilean made an acrobatic save from a shot by River substitute Gonzalo Martinez seven minutes from time to deny the South Americans a consolation goal.

Messi, who forced a smart save from Barovero in the early skirmishes and could himself have finished with a hat-trick, became the first player to score in three finals after leading Barca to victory in 2009 and 2011.

"Messi and Neymar wanted to play in the final, no matter what," said Suarez. "It shows the sacrifice that there is in the group that they did everything to play."

Barcelona added the world title to a host of other titles they have collected this year -- the Champions League, Spain's La Liga, the Copa del Rey and the European Super Cup.

Watford thump Liverpool

Adam Bogdan's embarrassing blunder cost lacklustre Liverpool dearly as Watford swept to a 3-0 success that gave them their first home win over the Reds for 29 years.

Jurgen Klopp's side had only themselves to blame for yesterday's chastening loss at Vicarage Road and Hungarian goalkeeper Bogdan was the chief culprit after dropping a routine corner that Nathan Ake converted for Watford's early opener.

More calamitous defending, this time from Martin Skrtel, allowed Odion Ighalo to double Watford's lead and the Nigerian forward completed Liverpool's misery with his second late on.

Liverpool's performance was comically bad at times and ranked as the heaviest loss of Klopp's two months in charge.

The Reds are now without a win in their last three Premier League matches, leaving them five points off the top four heading into the hectic Christmas period.

While Liverpool are some way short of the finished article, Quique Sanchez

Flores's Watford are enjoying their best season since the golden Graham Taylor era in the 1980s.

Even in a campaign already full of memorable performances, this was a landmark moment for Watford as they recorded their first victory over Liverpool since 1999 and their first on home soil since a John Barnes inspired win in December 1986.

The seventh-placed Hornets' fourth successive win lifted them to within one point of the top four and maintained the momentum of a remarkably strong showing in their first season back in the top-flight for eight years.

The match started horribly for Liverpool, as their goalkeeper Bogdan made a horrendous third minute mistake that gifted Watford the lead.

When Ben Watson curled over a corner, Bogdan appeared to have the ball in his grasp for what should have been a routine catch.

But the Hungarian fumbled it and on loan Chelsea left-back Ake pounced to prod the ball over the line.

Bogdan protested that the goal should have been ruled out for Ake kicking the ball out of his hands, but referee Mark Clattenburg disagreed.

And there was worse to come for Klopp in the 15th minute as Ighalo doubled Watford's lead thanks to more pitiful play from the Liverpool rearguard.

Skrtel was the guilty party as Ighalo chased Troy Deeney's ball over the top and the Slovakian centre-back allowed himself to be bullied into a panicked, weak tackle.

Ighalo seized the loose ball and drove a fine finish into the far corner for his 11th goal of the season and fourth in his last four games.

For once the sight of jubilant yellow and black clad supporters was unwelcome for Klopp, who enjoyed so many memorable days in those colours with his previous club Borussia Dortmund.

Bogdan still looked jittery and he almost presented Watford with a third when his limp punch hit a team-mate and had to be cleared off the line.

There was slightly more thrust to Liverpool's attacking play after the interval, with Jordan Henderson forcing a fine stop from Gomes, but it was hardly a tidal wave of pressure and the hosts surged forward one last time to make it three when Ighalo headed home Valon Behrami's cross in the 85th minute.

Real rout nine-men Rayo

Gareth Bale scored four times as Real Madrid came from behind to beat nine-man Rayo Vallecano 10-2 in a wild game at the Santiago Bernabeu to close the gap on La Liga leaders Barcelona and Atletico

Madrid to two points. It is the first time in 55 years that a team has scored 10 goals in a La Liga game.

However, the Madrid fans still voiced their disapproval towards under fire coach Rafael Benitez after Real found themselves 2-1 down inside 12 minutes.

Red cards inside half an hour for Tito and Raul Baena opened the floodgates, though, as a double from Cristiano Ronaldo and a hat-trick for Karim

Benzema added to Bale's most prolific day in three years as a Madrid player.

Atletico have the chance to extend their lead at the top back to five points later on Sunday when they visit Malaga.

Madrid president Florentino Perez had restated his support for Benitez in midweek after rumours suggested he was one defeat away from the sack after losing 1-0 at Villarreal last weekend.

Real had won their previous 14 meetings against their humble rivals from across Madrid and looked well set for another routine afternoon when Bale teed up Danilo for the opener after just three minutes.

Yet, Madrid's defensive deficiencies in recent weeks were exposed again when Antonio Amaya rose highest to head home Roberto Trashorras's corner.

And the defending was even worse from Danilo as he allowed Jozabed to head home from close range two

minutes later.

With the Madrid fans on the verge of full revolt, the hosts were handed a huge break when Tito needlessly lunged in on Toni Kroos and was rightly shown a straight red card.

Danilo made amends for his poor defending with a sensational cross for Bale to head home the fourth goal of the game after just 25 minutes.

More controversy was to follow when Baena was penalised for a pull on Sergio Ramos and was harshly shown his second yellow card to leave Rayo with nine men on the half hour mark.

Ronaldo made no mistake from the spot and Bale then exploited a huge gap in the Rayo defence to gallop clear and slot home his second.

The one way traffic continued after the break as James Rodriguez teed up Benzema for his sixth goal in his last four games.
