MUNICIPAL POLLS BNP shares its concern with envoys

The BNP yesterday told foreign envoys that deployment of the army during the December 30 municipal polls could ease people's "fear and concern" over holding the elections in a free and fair manner.


Briefing diplomats of 12 countries and representatives of United Nations and European Union, BNP leaders alleged the government is plotting to manipulate the polls.

Party's standing committee member Moyeen Khan led the BNP delegation at the meeting.

He informed the diplomats about the Election Commission's "subservient attitude" towards the government and its helplessness in taking action against the ministers, ruling party lawmakers and leaders, said meeting sources.

## SMS threats continue

Christians anxious but won't cave in to fear; home boss says police vigilant

Just two days before Christmas, Bishop Bejoy D'Cruze, a top spiritual leader of Christians in the country, received a death threat via text message on Tuesday night, a continuation of acts of terrorising the community leaders since early October.

Six others, including Bangladesh Christian Association (BCA) Secretary General Nirmal Rozario, also got similar threats the same

## TERROR-LINK ALLEGATION Pak diplomat 'withdrawn'

A Pakistani female diplomat was withdrawn from Bangladesh yesterday, weeks after allegations of her involvement in terror financing surfaced in the judicial statement of an Islamist militant.

Fareena Arshad, second secretary Fareena Arshad (political) at Pakistan High Commission in Dhaka, left the capital by a PIA flight in the afternoon after Dhaka asked Islamabad to recall her in 72 hours, said diplomatic sources. Bangladesh foreign ministry, instead of going for

harsher measures such as deportation, opted to have her withdrawn, added the sources.

Contacted, the foreign ministry and the high commission declined to comment on the matter

## Ruet student freed 14 days after 'kidnap'

Chhatra League leader Saifuzzaman Sohag, who allegedly was picked up from his Rajshahi home 14 days ago, has been found in Chittagong.

His "abductors" released him blindfolded near a roadside restaurant in Mirsarai in the early hours yesterday, Sohag's family said. "Sohag phoned me around 4:00am from a call shop

and said he had been freed," his father Akkas-uz-Zaman told The Daily Staryesterday afternoon. "I am overwhelmed with joy and now eagerly am

waiting to see him, " he said over the phone. Akkas rushed to Dhaka from Rajshahi as Sohag, a fourth year student of mechanical engineering at Rajshahi University of Engineering and Technology (Ruet), had

told him that he was going there from Chittagong. On December 10, Sohag was kidnapped from his home
