The show might seem a little slow at start, but it keeps getting more and more entertaining to an exciting climax. The ending truly leaves a fine imprint on the audiences mind.

5. You're Beautiful: This show is the wildest dream of an idol fan. It is a modern Korean adaptation of Shakespeare's play "Twelfth Night". The story revolves around a young trainee nun who has to masquerade as her singer twin brother and live with three handsome K-Pop idols at their dormitory, all of whom eventually fall in love with her.
