


The day is a public holiday in Bangladesh.

# Not a single culprit is booked

After 8 months, police submit final report

COURT CORRESPONDENT

Detectives yesterday submitted the final report in the case over sexual assault on women during this year's Pahela Baishakh celebrations, saying none of the culprits could be identified or arrested.

Sub-inspector Dipak Kumar Das of Detective

Branch (DB) of police, also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, gave the report to Dhaka Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court in the afternoon.

"The incidents of sexual assault [on women] took place during the Pahela Baishakh celebrations on the Dhaka University campus. We have submitted the final report but could not identify or arrest

any of the offenders," court sources quoted the IO as saying in the report.

Tribunal for Prevention of Women and Children Repression, which is dealing with the case, will now decide whether the report will be accepted. The tribunal will hold a hearing after the winter vacation ending on January 2, added the sources.

# Tied to tree, journo hacked to death His reports on drug peddling might be the reason

It was a planned murder. The killers hit him with sharp weapons in the head and hands, said police. The motive behind the killing
