# Judges to be appointed in a month

The government may take an initiative to promote some High Court judges to the Appellate Division in a month, as the apex court has been going through a shortage of judges for more than two years.

"Certainly, the government has a plan to appoint some judges to the Appellate Division from among the High Court judges. The appointment might be made in a month," Law Minister Anisul Huq told The Daily Star yesterday.

Earlier, he said the president, the prime minister and the chief justice would take the final decision about appointing judges to the apex court and it's they who know when the judges would be appointed.

The law minister, however, did not say why the vacant posts of Appellate Division judges were not filled.

Five out of 11 judges of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court have retired since 2013 but no new appointments have yet been made.

An SC source said Chief Justice Surendra Kumar Sinha had asked the government to take a move to appoint some judges to the Appellate Division through promoting HC judges.

An alleged Myanmarese yaba smuggler was killed when a gang of Myanmarese yaba smugglers and BGB exchanged fire in the Naf river in Teknaf upazila early yesterday.

The dead is Darbesh Miah, 35.

The Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) members also arrested Mohammad Salimullah, 20, a member of the gang, along with 30,000 yaba tablets, a bullet and two sharp weapons.

Acting on a tip-off, the BGB men challenged a boat near sluice gate-3 area in the Naf river around 3:30am. Instead of halting the boat, the yaba

# Saudi hospital 3 'outlaws' killed in fire kills at least 24

A fire tore through the intensive care unit and the maternity ward of a Saudi hospital before dawn yesterday, killing at least 24 people and injuring 123, officials said.

The fire broke out at the general hospital in the southwestern port city of Jazan, the capital of the Jizan region, one of Saudi Arabia's poorest areas.

The civil defence agency said 25 people died but a later statement by Health Minister Khalid al-Falih put the death toll at 24. Two of the dead were security guards and one was a child, officials said.

# 'gunfight' with Rab OUR CORRESPONDENT, Tangail

Three alleged members of a faction of banned Purba Banglar Communist Party (PBCP) were killed in a "gunfight" with Rab in Tangail Sadar upazila early yesterday.

The dead are Omar Miah, 28, alleged chief of the district unit's PBCP (ML-Lal Pataka), Abul Kashem, 25, and Saddam Hossain, 30, two other local top leaders of the outfit, claimed the elite force. The three are from different villages in Baghil union of the upazila.

However, Mostafizur Rahman, officer-in-charge (investigation) of Tangail Model Police Station, said the deceased were listed criminals and they committed various crimes, using the name of the PBCP.

They stood accused of about a dozen criminal cases, including murder, robbery and kidnapping, with the police station, he said. On information that a secret meeting of the PBCP was being held in

Omarpur village, a Rab team raided the village around 3:50am, said SEE PAGE 17 COL 4
