An association of leftleaning teachers of Jahangirnagar University yesterday demanded removal of the proctor who allegedly instigated, during a phone conversation, a Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) leader to create unrest on the campus last week. Proctor Tapan Kumar

Saha has "lost moral ground to hold on to the position", Shikkhak Mancha said in a statement. Seeking anonymity,

some teachers said Vice Chancellor Prof Farzana Islam was trying to protect the proctor instead of taking legal steps against him.

Govt action demanded to save Dhaka rivers Bangladesh Nodi Bachao Andolon forms human chains

Bangladesh Nodi Bachao Andolon formed several human chains beside the Turag river yesterday to call for saving the rivers of Dhaka from grabbing and pollution.

paddy", they added.

The organisation along with other likeminded ones formed human chains at 15 sites along the bank of the river between Bosila in the capital and Kaliakoir in Gazipur demanding government action in

saving rivers. Untreated industrial and chemical effluent along with human excreta and burnt oil directly released into the Turag, Balu, Buriganga and Shitalakkhya have poisoned the rivers and ruined riverine ecology and livelihood, said Md Anwar Hossain, general secretary of Bangladesh Nodi Bachao Andolon.

On the other hand, constant grabbing and wrongly demarcated boundaries have shrunk the rivers, particularly the Turag, said Hossain at one of the human chains on Tongi Bridge.

Water expert M Inamul Huq demanded political commitment for protecting the rivers in peril.

Green activists at the human chain at different sites, including Bosila, Dhour Bridge, Kamarpara Bridge, Kodda Bazar and Kashimpur Bazar Ghat, echoed Hossain and said the population would be wiped out if the rivers were not saved.

Gonoswasthya Kendra trustee Dr Nazimuddin Ahmed, among others, was present.

Dhaka city AL hasn't seen new leaders since 2003

The Dhaka city unit of the Awami League has been without new elected leadership for more than a decade would get fresh blood anytime soon.

AL held the last three-yearly council of the unit on December 27, 2012, but it did not see any voting, hence no new leaders. Today marks the end of that three-year tenure.

The city leaders, who were elected in 2003, are still at the helm.

When asked, the city leaders said they did not know whether the incumbent would run the city affairs or, as per a previous proposal, the existing committee would be split into two --

Dhaka north and south. Sources within AL said two draft lists of committee members for two

parts of Dhaka city were sent to the cil that was held on December 29, party president, Sheikh Hasina, for 2012. endorsement recently. The committees will be announced after her approval, but the central AL leaders do not know now, and there are no signs that it when the announcement will come. where Mohammad Hanif was made

In the last council, nearly 2,000 councillors and 3,000 delegates of Dhaka city AL gathered to elect new leadership through voting but it ended without any voting.

At the council, the city AL left the decision to pick new leaders with the party chief, while the AL central working committee decided that MA Aziz and Mofazzal Hossain Chowdhury Maya would continue as acting president and general secretary of the city unit until a new committee was

announced. Dhaka city was supposed to get a announced full committees only in new committee after AL's central coun-

The city unit's December 2012 council took place nine years after the previous one, held on June 18, 2003, president and Maya general secretary. After Hanif's demise on November 28, 2006, MA Aziz was made acting president.

After the council, the AL chief several times said the city committee would be announced after holding councils of all units under Dhaka city and asked city leaders to hold the councils immediately.

There are 26 thana, 103 ward and 17 union units under Dhaka city. The city AL held councils at all units except two -- Jatrabari and Demra thanas -- but SEE PAGE 5 COL 4
