# Coal power loses steam

A system will fail if the controller

and users are not sincere

Only two of 24 planned coal-fired power projects making progress


In the last six years, the Awami League government has made significant progress in the power sector virtually eliminating the phenomenon of load shedding. But this success may grind to a halt in the near future as the government's new plans to build two dozen large coal power plants are going nowhere fast. In the last four years, the government rolled out plans

and bids to build large coal fired power plants totalling 20 thousand megawatt capacity—which is almost three times the electricity available to the nation today. Coal is cheap and it was chosen as an alternative to natu-

ral gas for power generation. As gas resources are depleting fast, the government wants one third of the country's power to be generated with coal by 2030.

Out of these two dozen coal power projects, only two are actually making physical progress. These are the Rampal and the Matarbari power projects.

Sources blame bureaucratic bottleneck, lack of strong leadership in the related authorities and lack of understanding SEE PAGE 2 COL 5

### Teachers go on nonstop strike Jan 11

The Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers' Association (FBUTA) will begin indefinite work abstention at all public universities from January 11 if the government did not remove the "discriminatory provisions" in the eighth national pay scale.

The federation has demanded that the government issue a gazette notification removing the "discriminatory provisions" by January 10.

The platform of teachers of 37 public universities made the decision after a meeting at a Dhaka University auditorium yesterday.

The teachers would also wear black badges while conducting classes from today and would observe a two-hour work stoppage at universities from 11:00am on January 7, said Prof ASM Maksud Kamal, secretary general of the FBUTA, while announcing the programmes at a press briefing.

## 8 killed in Indian air force base attack

Pak militants blamed; Delhi vows 'befitting response'

Militants launched a deadly attack on an Indian Air Force base near the Pakistan border yesterday, exchanging fire with Indian forces who, backed by tanks and helicopters, battled for more than 15 hours before wresting back control of the compound.

## Saudi executes 47 for terrorism

Top Shia cleric among the executed

Sunni Muslim Saudi Arabia yesterday executed a prominent Shia cleric, who had been behind anti-government protests, drawing angry condemnation from Shia-majority Iran and Iraq.

The execution of Nimr al-Nimr and 46 other men, including Shia activists and Sunnis accused of involvement in al-Qaeda killings, was announced by the interior ministry.




