Death penalty for 2 sought at ICT

Prosecution completes arguments

STAFF CORRESPONDENT

The prosecution yesterday sought death penalty for Obaidul Haque Taher and Ataur Rahman Nani for allegedly committing crimes in Netrakona during the 1971 Liberation War.

Prosecutor Mukhlesur Rahman Badal made the plea before the International Crimes Tribunal-1, as the prosecution completed their closing arguments on factual aspects saying that they have been able to prove five of the six charges brought against them "beyond any shadow of doubt."

The three-member tribunal, led by Justice Anwarul Haque, asked the defence counsel to place their arguments today and prosecution to place their arguments on legal points after defence submission.

Taher and Nani, two alleged members of Razakar Bahini, an auxiliary force of the Pakistani occupation army, however, pleaded not guilty before the tribunal.

FEAR OF AL-BNP FACE-OFF IN CAPITAL

People suffer as most 'snatchers' to book buses go off streets

People had difficulties commuting in the capital yesterday as few buses were on the streets in anticipation that there would be a violent face-off between the Awami League and BNP.

The two major parties called three separate rallies in the city yesterday, marking the second anniversary of the January 5 national election.

In different parts of the city, people especially women struggled to get into buses but most of the time they failed because of impenetrable crowds at the door.

There were also traffic jams at some places. The ruling AL organised the gatherings at Bangabandhu Avenue and Russell Square, at Nayapaltan.

The public sufferings worsened when, · unlike on normal days, buses kept their doors shut.

Muggers snatch Tk 28.47 lakh shooting driver

Muggers snatched Tk 28.47 lakh after shooting a driver of Premier Cement Mills Ltd in Fatullah in Narayanganj district yesterday.

Rajab Ali was admitted to a private hospital in the capital with bullet wounds in his left hand.

Rezaul Karim, chief coordinator of the mill, told The Daily Star that five muggers on two motorcycles intercepted their microbus in Kashipur area around 1:00pm, beat their three staff up and shot the driver when they were returning to the mill at Muktarpur in Munshiganj after withdrawing the money

Cox's Bazar war crime accused dies

War crimes accused Md Jinnah alias Jinnat Ali died at Shaheed Tajuddin Ahmad Medical College Hospital in Gazipur early yesterday.

Jinnat, 58, had been in Kashimpur High Security Jail for last five months and was rushed to the jail hospital with chest pain on Monday night, our Gazipur correspondent reports quoting Mizanur Rahman, superintendent of Kashimpur Central Jail.

Later, he was rushed to the medical college hospital where doctor declared him dead around 12:45am yesterday, Mizanur said.

Jinnat, 58, of Muhurirdail village in Maheshkhali upazila of Cox's Bazar, was one of the 19 men from the district against whom the investigation agency of the International Crimes Tribunal found evidence in connection with the crimes committed during the 1971

Liberation War. Police arrested Jinnat on May 21 last year following the arrest warrant issued SEE PAGE 4 COL 4

PAHELA BAISHAKH Chhatra Union rejects probe report on sexual assaults at DU

Bangladesh Chhatra Union activists yesterday rejected the probe report which stated that none of the culprits, who sexually assaulted women during last year's Pahela Baishakh celebration, could be identified or arrested.

Detectives submitted the final report before a Dhaka Court on December 24, about eight months after the assaults took place.

Chhatra Union activists were the first ones to resist the sexual assaults on 20 women on Dhaka University campus for over an hour on April 14 evening. Chhatra Union leader Liton Nandi and some of his friends were injured while scuffling with the assaulters.

At a rally held before the National Museum in the capital yesterday, the Chhatra Union activists urged police to undertake a fresh investigation

for construction of a food storehouse for next six months.

The court also issued a rule upon the authorities concerned of the government to explain why their inaction to protect the pond should not be declared illegal and why they should not be directed to take steps to protect the waterbody.

The HC bench of Justice Moyeenul Islam Chowdhury and Justice Md Iqbal Kabir came up with the order and rule after hearing a writ petition filed by the Human Rights and Peace for Bangladesh challenging the legality of filling the pond for construction of the storehouse.

Petitioner's lawyer Manzill Murshid told The Daily Star that the government had reportedly started filling earth in the pond to the south side of Barisal Medical College and near the Kirtonkhola River to construct the godown in it violating the Water Bodies Act.
