AL, BNP RALLIES No violence; conditions violated

Not a single incident of violence took place centring the rallies held by the Awami League and the BNP in the capital yesterday, much to the relief of city dwellers.

However, there were violations of the set of conditions imposed by the Dhaka Metropolitan Police on Monday on the parties for holding their rallies.

Obama pleads for 'urgency' on gun control

US President Barack Obama grew emotional yesterday as he made a passionate call for a national "sense of urgency" to limit gun violence.

He was introduced by Mark Barden, whose son Daniel was killed in the 2012 massacre at Sandy Hook Elementary School in Connecticut. Obama circled back to that shooting in the final moments of his speech.

"Every time I think about those kids, it gets me mad," Obama said, pausing to wipe away tears.

He added: "And by the way, it happens on the streets of Chicago every day," referring to his hometown where he began his political career.

The White House is introducing a new requirement that would expand background checks for buyers. The measure

City utility networks exposed to danger

May cause major casualties if damaged by strong earthquake, say experts

Damaged utility networks of Dhaka would be the main cause for casualties in the event of a major earthquake and the capital might need to be abandoned even, experts said.

Gas, electricity, water, and sewerage lines would be damaged immensely during the earthquake and the number of casualties would be high due to fires, which rescuers would most likely be unable to reach and put out.

The earthquake experts said rescue operations could collapse completely.

Painting the grim picture, they said immediate steps to improve the total system of the utility networks were needed to get rid of this vulnerability of Dhaka.

Dhaka has 1,834km of gas transmission pipes and there would be leaks in 56 places and cracks would develop in 191 places, said Prof ASM Maksud Kamal, chairman of department of disaster science

and management of Dhaka University, quoting a 2010 survey done by the Comprehensive Disaster Management Programme.

There were 1,118km of underground water pipes in the city and if the Madhupur fault had an earthquake of 7.5 magnitude, pipes would leak in 79 points and pipes would break in 272 places, he said.

In the 630km of sewerage network, there would be leaks in 107 places and cracks in 360 points, the professor said.

Overhead electricity poles and snapping of cables would be a major problem too. At least 16,000 electricity poles out of 56,000 would topple during the tremor, he said.

Maksud suggested using gas cylinders instead of underground pipelines for providing gas to homes and installing earthquake-resistant gas pipes in phases. An automatic gas transmission control system was required, he added.

1,009 not out

Fifteen-year-old Pranav Dhanawade made history on Tuesday when he became the first ever batsman in any class of cricket to score 1,000 runs in a single innings. Smashing 129 fours and 59 sixes, he reached 1,009 runs before his team decided to declare.

Playing for KC Gandhi School, Dhanawade reached the gigantic score in just 323 deliveries with a jaw-dropping strike rate of 312.38 in a game against Arya Gurukul in the Bhandari Cup interschool tournament organised by the Mumbai Cricket Association.

LAND DISPUTE Two killed in

bomb attack

Two people were killed after unknown assailants hurled bombs at a tea stall in Gangadaspur village of Chuadanga's Jibonnagar upazila on Monday night.

Victims' families allege that the attack was carried out over a land dispute.

The dead are Mohammad Ali, 50, and Sahabuddin, 70. They were locals.

Quoting witnesses, Humayun Kabir, officer-incharge of Jibonnagar Police Station, said out of nowhere, a group of some 15 unidentified men threw seven handmade bombs at the tea stall around 7:30pm, killing Ali on the spot and injuring three others.

The injured were rushed to Jessore General Hospital where Sahabuddin died SEE PAGE 10 COL 4



ATTACK ON KIBRIA

Court accepts charges against 32 accused

A Habiganj special court yesterday accepted the charge sheet against 32 accused in a case filed over grenade attack that killed Awami League leader and former finance minister SAMS Kibria.

The accused include former state minister for home Lutfozzaman Babar, Harkat-ul-Jihad-al-Islami (Huji) leader Mufti Hannan, expelled Sylhet mayor Ariful Haque Chowdhury and newly elected Habiganj Mayor GK Gaus.

On Aug 5 last year, the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) submitted the charge sheet in the case lodged under the Explosive Substances Act.

Of the 32 accused, 14 are behind bars, 10 are on the run and eight are on bail.

Taking cognizance of the charge sheet, Special Trial Tribunal-1 Judge Md Atabullah issued arrest SEE PAGE 10 COL 4

All terrorists are dead

Says Indian defence minister on air base attack; Sharif assures Modi of Pakistan's support in probe after US urges Pak action

Indian security forces have killed all six militants who launched an assault on a military air base in northern India that killed seven security personnel and injured 22, Defence Minister Manohar Parrikar said yesterday.

"There is no suspected terrorist inside right now. (Still) I will not give a negative report till the combing operations are over. The combing operations may be over by tomorrow," he said in reply to questions.

While praising Indian security forces for eliminating the attackers, Parrikar also alluded to "some gaps" in security that allowed the attackers to reach the base in the northwestern state of Punjab.

It has emerged that the militants hijacked a police officer's car but that his call to a colleague, after he was dumped by the roadside, was not taken seriously. The National Investigation Agency, a central body set up to probe such cross-border attacks, is investigating.

This is to inform the general public that uncontrolled use of ionizing radiation is harmful for human health and environment. In order to ensure safe use of ionizing radiation Bangladesh Government promulgated Bangladesh Atomic Energy Regulatory (BAER) Act 2012 and Nuclear Safety and Radiation Control Rules (NSRC) 1997. According to this act and rules it is mandatory to obtain appropriate license or permit from Bangladesh Atomic Energy Regulatory Authority (BAERA) to carry out activities involving radioactive sources such as Tc-99m, I-131, I-125, F-18, Cs-137, Am-241, Kr-85, Sr-90, Ir-192, Co-60, Am-Be etc or devices producing ionizing radiation for example X-Ray, CT, Fluoroscopy, Mammography, Angiogram, C-arm, Dental X-ray, OPG, Bone Densitometer, Co-60 Teletherapy, Brachytherapy, Linear Accelerator, Medical Cyclotron, Deep X-ray therapy, Co-60 Irradiator, Tc-99m Generator, Nuclear Gauge, X-ray Florescence (XRF), X-ray Diffraction (XRD), Luggage Scanner, Electron Capture Detector (ECD), Blood Irradiator, Smoke Detector etc. Apart from the abovementioned radioactive sources or devices, the equipments which are used in the activities associated with radiation exposure for example Gamma Camera, Positron Emission Tomography (PET), PET-CT, Single Photon Emission Computed Tomography (SPECT), SPECT-CT, Gamma Knife, Thyroid Uptake System, Radioimmunoassay (RIA) equipments, Rectilinear Scanner etc. are also required by act to have appropriate license from BAERA. The person(s) or the organization(s) yet to have obtained or applied for license(s) are requested to take urgent initiative for obtaining relevant license(s) from BAERA.

Necessary legal action will be executed soon against the violator of the act/rule. Your cooperation for ensuring use of ionizing radiation is highly appreciated.
