PUBLIC UNIVERSITIES Teachers stage sit-in, observe 2-hour strike

Public university teachers yesterday observed twohour work abstention, demanding the removal of "discriminatory provisions" from the eighth national pay scale. Under the banner of the

Federation of Bangladesh University Teachers' Association, they demanded that the government issue a gazette notification, removing those provisions by January 10.

They will otherwise go on an indefinite work abstention at all public universities, except National University, from the following day.

As part of a prescheduled programme, Dhaka University teachers staged a sit-in at 11:00am in front of Aparajeyo Bangla. The demonstration SEE PAGE 17 COL 1

Dhaka, Riyadh to cooperate in fighting terror

Bangladesh and Saudi Arabia have expressed their firm resolve to cooperate in the fight against terrorism and extremism through meaningful cooperation. Foreign Minister AH Mahmood Ali,

who met his Saudi counterpart Adel bin Ahmed Al-Jubeir in Riyadh on Wednesday, discussed the issue at a meeting, according to a foreign ministry press release issued yesterday.

However, neither of the governments released any details on how they would cooperate to combat terrorism.

Bangladesh joined as a founder member of the Saudi Arabia-led 34-nation Islamic Military Coalition, and there was indication that the foreign minister was due to discuss details about the alliance, PHOTO ON PAGE 2 SEE PAGE 17 COL 5

Not ready to face catastrophe

Earthquake preparedness in dismal state; awareness, rescue equipment inadequate

With the risk of a major earthquake to cause colossal devastation any time, Bangladesh still lacks elementary awareness with preparedness lying in a deplorable state, according to eminent seismic experts.

Unplanned urbanisation on filled-up marshland and low-lying flood flow zones has left the capital highly vulnerable to earthquake hazards, they warn.

Despite setting a target of creating 62,000 trained rescue volunteers, the six years of second Comprehensive Disaster Management Programme (CDMP) could not train up even half of them, according to Programme Director Md Abdul

A 7.5-magnitude earthquake in or close to Bangladesh territory would result in collapse of or severe damage to more than 70,000 buildings in Dhaka city as per CDMP findings, he says.

"But we have neither elementary lifesaving awareness nor adequate open space for evacuation and medical treatment. Dhaka city lacks open space required for field hospitals to take care of thousands of injured in case of a massive earthquake.

"The open space earmarked in the earthquake contingency plan for Dhaka in some cases has been illegally occupied. The government has to take an

CHARLIE HEBDO ANNIV Man with knife shot dead by Paris police

French police shot dead a knife-wielding man yesterday as he attacked a police station in Paris, a year to the day since jihadist gunmen killed 12 people at Charlie Hebdo newspaper.

The man reportedly shouted "Allahu Akbar" (God is Greatest) and was wearing what appeared to be an explosives vest although it was later found to be a fake, police and government sources said.

News of the attack came just after President Francois Hollande concluded a sombre speech at police headquarters to mark the anniversary of the killings at Charlie Hebdo's offices on January 7, 2015. "On Thursday morning, a

man attempted to attack a policeman at the reception of the police station before being hit by shots from the police," interior ministry spokesman Pierre-Henry Brandet said. Explosives experts were

deployed to the scene in the multi-ethnic Goutte d'Or district, close to the Gare du Nord international station. The man was found to

have been wearing a pouch SEE PAGE 17 COL 4

A haven for migratory birds

The chirping sound of migratory birds pierces the silence at Char Moazzin in Patuakhali district.

Suicide bomb kills 50 at Libya police school

A suicide truck bombing on a police training centre in Libya's western city of Zliten killed at least 50 people yesterday, in one of the deadliest attacks yet to hit the strife-torn country.

A suicide bomber detonated an explosives-laden truck used for carrying water at a police school in central Zliten, a coastal city about 170 kilometres east of the capital

Tripoli, a local security source said.

A witness in Zliten told AFP some 300 men, mainly coast guards, were inside the training compound at the time of the blast.

Health ministry spokesman Ammar Mohammed Ammar said 50 to 55 people had been killed and at least 100 wounded and that victims were being treated in several hospitals. Urgent calls were issued for blood donations.
