

# Insurgency will see zero tolerance: PM

BSS, Dhaka

Reiterating the government's "zero tolerance policy" against terrorism and militancy, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said none would be allowed to use Bangladesh for conducting insurgent activities against any country.

"We won't tolerate any sort of insurgency in Bangladesh... We want a peaceful atmosphere in this region," she told visiting Power, Rural and Urban Development and Transport Minister of Indian State of Tripura Manik Dey in her official residence Gono Bhaban in the capital.

After the meeting, PM's Press Secretary Ihsanul Karim briefed reporters that Hasina was happy because officials of Bangladesh and India finalised tariff and other issues regarding importing 100 megawatt electricity from Tripura.

She hoped that both sides would soon complete the remaining formalities to start the electricity supply.

The Tripura minister said Tripura will soon start the electricity supply and the state government is constructing a power plant at Monarchar in Tripura near Comilla border of Bangladesh. Regarding trade and industrialisation, Hasina said Bangladesh is now the most attractive destination for investment and her government has undertaken steps to establish 100 economic zones to boost further industrialisation and generate employment in the country.

The premier said Bangladesh wants to reopen the rail routes connecting Bangladesh and India which remained closed since the 1965 war. Her government has taken initiatives to set up dual gauge rail tracks from Chittagong to Dhaka to enhance connectivity and communications, she mentioned.

The Tripura minister said, "Bangladesh achieved unprecedented development in road connectivity."

Highlighting the potentiality of the Chittagong Sea Port, she said India can use the port for enhancing bilateral trade and commerce.

# Road crashes kill 10

Ten people were killed and 13 others injured in road accidents in seven districts yesterday and on Saturday.

In Bogra, a school teacher was killed and another teacher injured when a goods-laden truck knocked down their motorcycle on Gabtoli-Bogra road at Shandhabari in the district's Gabtoli upazila yesterday.

The deceased was Khorshed Alam, 52, an assistant teacher of the upazila's Chakma Government Primary School.

Injured teacher Abdul Latif Mithu, 45, of Khidropori Government Primary School in the same area was admitted to a local hospital.

In Rajshahi, a Dhaka-bound bus hit an auto-rickshaw in Bhadra area under Boalia Police Station, leaving Emdadul Haque Sarker, 65,

former deputy general manager of Rajshahi Krishi Unnayan Bank, critically injured, reports BSS.

He later died at Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

In Gazipur, three persons, including a baby, were killed and 12 others injured as a speeding truck abruptly struck a roadside shop near Dharasrom rail crossing on Chittagong-Gazipur highway yesterday.

The deceased were shopkeeper Hassan Ali, 70, his eight-month-old grandson Zubair and Moslem Uddin, 65.

The injured were admitted to different hospitals.

In Dhaka, a human hauler hit street vendor Shanu, 30, near Babu Bazar Bridge in old Dhaka yesterday, leaving him injured.

He later died at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

In Habiganj, a vehicle hit a boy named Tamim Hasan when he was crossing a road in Kamalkhani area in Baniachong upazila yesterday, leaving him injured, reports BSS.

Tamim later died at a hospital.

In Natore, Sabina Begum, 52, a resident of Sadar upazila, also a worker of Pran Medical, was killed when a Barisal-bound BRTC bus hit her on Natore-Rajshahi highway in Dakmara area on Saturday.

Meanwhile, in another incident on the same day, a boy named Arafat Hossain was killed as a truck ran him over on Dattapara-Dhorail road in the upazila's Lalmonipur area.

In Dinajpur, a speeding truck hit a rickshaw-puller in Parbatipur upazila on Saturday night, leaving him dead on the spot.

The deceased was Minhazul Islam, 35, son of Yasin Ali of the upazila.

## Shop owner, customer hack each other

Three others also injured over paying bill in capital

A customer and a snack shop owner hacked each other following a dispute over bill payment in the capital's Hazaribagh yesterday.

Three family members of the shop owner Jahangir Hossain, 45, were also injured in a clash between them and the customer Masud.

Jahangir alleged that after having snacks and tea at his shop, Masud refused to pay the bill. Instead, he slapped Jahangir's two sons when they asked for it, leading to the clash, he said.

At one stage, Masud took a machete from a nearby shop and attacked Jahangir, prompting him to launch a counter attack after snatching the weapon, said Hazaribagh Police Station Officer-in-Charge Mir Alimuzzaman.

Jahangir, his wife Parvin Begum, 40, and their sons Sujan and Sajal took treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital; while Masud was admitted to the National Institute of Traumatology and Orthopaedic Rehabilitation.

told him to call relatives for arranging the money, he further alleged.

The policemen then kept on slapping and kicking him whilst the pickup travelled on different streets in the area. The policemen released him around 2:30am, Rabbi said.

Rabbi later took primary treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Rabbi, also a former news anchor at a television channel, filed a complaint with Mohammad Police Station.

Asked, SI Masud refuted the allegation brought against him. He, however, admitted that he had a conversation with Rabbi during the time the complaint mentioned.

Officer-in-Charge Jamaluddin Mir of Mohammadpur Police Station said he received a complaint.

Quoting SI Masud, the OC said a patrol team frisked Rabbi as he was out late at night. But Rabbi refused to cooperate. Later, the policemen handed him over to his friends.

Contacted, Deputy Commissioner Biplab Kumar Sarkar of Tejgaon Division of Dhaka Metropolitan Police said he had heard about the incident.

"We have taken permission from the Forest Department to cut the trees and given it Tk 1.2 crore as compensation," he said.  
He added 20,000 trees would be felled. The embankment is dilapidated, and for saving the city, the road is being built, he said. The official, however, recognised that it would temporarily leave an impact on the environment. "After concluding the project, we will plant 50,000 saplings," he said.

When asked, Director of Department of Environment (DoE) Azadur Rahman Mollick said they were not the appropriate authority to say no to the tree felling.

CDA is implementing the 15km project at a cost of Tk 1,700 crore, said officials. They hope the project would change the present look of Chittagong and play a big role in turning it into a modern industrialised city with better
