

# People of 4 villages suffer as bridge breaks

Over 10,000 people of four villages of Nilganj union in Kalapara upazila under the district are suffering a lot as the bridge on Ural canal has become unusable after a few wooden sleepers of it broke under the pressure of a paddy-laden improvised van on Friday.  
Seven people received minor injuries due to the accident.  
Local Government Engineering Department

(LGED) constructed the bridge with iron structure and wooden slippers in 1992-93 fiscal year to ease communication from Uttar Nilganj, Faridganj, Naubhanga and Nilganj villages to Kalapara upazila headquarters.  
Hundreds of students of different educational institutions including Faridganj High school, Faridganj Government Primary School and Naubhanga Senior Madrasa in the upazila town also used it

regularly.  
The bridge was damaged during super cyclone Sidr in 2007 and Kalapara upazila administration repaired it three years ago at a cost of Tk one lakh, local union parishad sources said.  
Samia and Ety Moni, both students of Faridganj High School, said they have to cover additional four kilometres to go to school after the bridge broke.  
A large number of vegetable growers of Nilganj union

are facing problem to carry their produce to Kalapara upazila town for sale, said Shamsul Haque Gazi, a local vegetable grower.  
Abdul Maleque Khan, chairman of Nilganj union parishad, said, "We will try to repair the bridge as soon as possible as it has great importance. We will raise the issue in the upcoming monthly meeting of the upazila development committee to solve the problem."

# BCL men 'assault' engr for Tk 1 lakh

A group of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) men allegedly assaulted an engineer at his office at Char Bewtha in the district yesterday.  
The victim is Alamgir Hossain, project in-charge of Navana Construction in the area.  
The firm is building a bridge on the River Kalaiganga after the name of Ramzan Ali, former mayor of Manikganj municipality.  
The engineer alleged that Samapta Hossain, former vice president of district unit of BCL, had been demanding Tk one lakh from him for the last seven days for giving reception to newly elected mayor Gazi Kamrul Huda Selim who defeated AL candidate Md Ramzan Ali in the recent municipality polls.  
Samapta along with his six supporters went to the office of the engineer around 11:00am and forced his material suppliers to come out from there.  
Later, they confined him to the office and demanded

the money. Being refused, the BCL men started beating him mercilessly, said the victim.  
On information, police rushed to the spot and rescued the engineer, said Aminur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Manikganj Sadar Police Station.  
A case was filed, accusing six to seven people, including Samapta, said the OC.  
Contacted, the BCL leader refuted the allegation.  
Away in Thakurgaon, five local BCL men in the district have been expelled on charge of violating party discipline, reports our correspondent.  
The party's central committee took the decision in an emergency meeting held at the central office in Dhaka on Saturday night, said Zakir Hossain, general secretary of central committee of BCL.  
They were expelled for violating party discipline, he said.  
The expelled BCL activists are GM Siraji Mizan, Sourav Chandra Das, Khalid Siraj Roki, Mahbub Alam and Saddam Hossain.

### Locals encircle DB men

Local people encircled several members of Detective Branch (DB) of police for an hour on Saturday night at Khalpara in Thakurgaon municipality area as they allegedly tried to arrest a youth after keeping a pack of hemp forcibly in his project. Local sources said a team of DB police led by Sub-Inspector Zahangir Alam went to Khalpara around 8:00pm and started moving around in the area. At one stage, constable Ruhul Amin intercepted one Saddam Hossain, 22, and forcibly put a packet of hemp in his pocket so as to arrest him for carrying drugs. Observing the situation, locals protested the incident and encircled them for an hour. Later, with the initiative of the local Awami League leader, the DB men freed Saddam and left the place.

### School student killed by friend

A school student was killed allegedly by a friend near Shah Mostofa Road area in Sadar upazila of the district at around 9:00pm on Saturday. Police sent the body to Moulvibazar Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy yesterday. The deceased was identified as Nadim Uddin, 16, of Berichar village in the upazila. He was a student of Class X. Police, quoting locals, said the victim's friend, Imon Miah, 17, locked in an altercation with Nadim and at one stage, he stabbed Nadim with a sharp weapon, leaving him dead on the spot. Police said Imon killed Nadim as a sequel to a previous enmity.

### Transport leader assaulted

Unidentified criminals assaulted Badal Pramanik, secretary of transport workers' association of Natore, at Kanaikhal in the town yesterday afternoon. Agitated workers blocked the Natore-Dhaka highway in protest for one hour from 4:00pm. Badal Pramanik said the criminals assaulted him mercilessly without any provocation. He demanded arrest of the attackers. Mizanur Rahman, officer-in-charge of Natore Police Station, said some unidentified criminals assaulted Badal Pramanik at around 3:00pm. Later, agitated workers blocked the main road, but police rushed to the spot and dispersed them. Police arrested Badal Pramanik, Rajib Hossain and Sohail Rana from the blockade.

### Coastguards seize Indian sarees

A team of coastguards seized illegal sarees worth over Tk 3 crore from a trawler on the Sandhya River in Ujirpur upazila of the district yesterday afternoon. Lt M Arif Hossain of the coastguard's southern zone said, acting on a tip-off about smuggling of Indian sarees by a trawler, a patrol team of coastguards took position under Shikarpur bridge on the Sandhya River yesterday morning. The law enforcers seized a trawler carrying the smuggled sarees. "We were not able to arrest any smuggler from the trawler," said Lt Arif Hosain.

# Gang kills night guard, takes away transformer

Criminals stole an electric transformer after killing a night guard at Mollapara village under Kalai upazila of Joypurhat district early yesterday.  
The gang also beat up an imam of a local mosque as he came forward to help the night guard.  
The dead is Shahnur Rahman, 45, son of late Ismail Hossain of Indahar village in the upazila.  
The incident took place at around 3:00am.  
Police, quoting locals, said a gang of 8/10 members came to village and climbed an electric pole to steal an electric transformer. As Shahnur Rahman tried to resist them, the gang stabbed him on his head.  
Hearing Shahnur's screams imam Abdul Hamid rushed in, but the gang members beat him up mercilessly and left the spot. Night guard Shahnur died a few minutes later.  
Being informed, police went to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to Joypurhat Modern Hospital for autopsy. The injured imam is undergoing treatment at Kalai Upazila

Health Complex.  
Contacted, Officer-in-Charge Sirajul Islam of Kalai Police Station said they have already launched a drive to arrest the gang members.  
**Abducted girl rescued**

An abducted schoolgirl was rescued from Banbhasa village in Sadar upazila of the district yesterday.  
Police arrested Laizu Begum, 32, wife of Akkas Ali of Rangpur city, for her alleged involvement in the abduction.  
The victim is Mohana Akhter, 7, daughter of Abdul Momin of Balapukur village in Aditmari upazila.  
Family sources said Laizu lured the girl with chocolate and picked up her when she was returning home from Balapukur Bazar at noon.  
On information, the villagers rushed to the spot and rescued the girl.

### Girl gang-raped

A girl was raped in Shatrumardon area under Dakkhin Sunamganj upazila of Sunamganj district around 7:00pm on Saturday. Officer-in-Charge (OC) Al-Amin of Dakkhin Sunamganj Police Station said two youths--Faruq and Badal Sutradhar Bablu--of the area intercepted the girl while she was returning home from a haor after collecting grass. They took her to a place in the area and raped her, he added. Hearing screams, locals rescued the girl and sent her to Habiganj Sadar Hospital for medical test. Later, she was referred to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital. The girl's cousin filed a case with Dakkhin Sunamganj Police Station at around 9:00am yesterday.

# Brothers-in-law kill schoolboy for property!

Police recovered the decomposed body of a schoolboy, killed allegedly by brothers-in-law, from Madhupur forest on Saturday night.  
Earlier on January 12, police arrested three people including two brothers-in-law of the boy in this connection.  
The victim, Jewel Rana, 14, only son of Hasan Ali of Mohishmara village, reads in Class VIII at a private school in Dhaka, staying at the house of his third

brother-in-law Obaidul Haque, family members said.  
He recently came home and his brother-in-law Azam took him from the house on January 11, saying that he will teach the boy how to drive motorcycle.  
But Jewel did not return as of next day while Azam claimed that he had sent him back to the house after teaching driving.  
Jewel's uncle Mozaffar Hossain lodged a general diary with Madhupur Police Station in this regard that day and Sub-Inspector

Abdul Hakim of the police station detained Jewel's two brothers-in-law (first and second) -- Azmat Ali, 30, of Phulbaria in Mymensingh, and Azam Ali, 28, of Mohishmara in Madhupur, and Azam's nephew Nazrul Islam, 27, the same night, police said.  
Following information from the three people, police recovered Jewel's decomposed body hanging from a gajari tree at Beribaid area of Madhupur forest on Saturday night and sent it to Tangail Medical College Hospital morgue for

autopsy, they added.  
During preliminary interrogation, the three detainees told the police that the brothers-in-law conspired to kill Jewel for misappropriating the properties that the boy would get from his father as his only son, said Mohammad Shafiqul Islam, officer-in-charge of Madhupur Police Station.  
The victim's father filed a case against the three detainees with the police station yesterday in this regard and police started investigation, he added.

# MP Liton's bail further extended

A court here yesterday further extended interim bail of Manjurul Islam Liton, ruling party lawmaker from Gaibandha-1 constituency, till February 17 in a case for shooting a schoolboy of Sundarganj upazila in the district.  
Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate Muniruzzaman Sikder passed the order when Liton appeared before the court with a petition seeking permanent bail, said court sources.  
The lawmaker was in jail for 24 days and released on November 8 last year to allow him to join the parliament session. The court granted him interim bail until the prorogation of the session.  
After completion of last parliament session, the lawmaker's lawyer sought permanent bail for him on November 24 in the same court but the court extended interim bail till December 8. Later, his bail was further extended till January 17 this year.  
On October 2 last year, the lawmaker shot school student Sourav, for no reason while he was returning home in a car from Sundarganj. Liton went into hiding soon

# 15 trafficked boys reunite with parents after 3 years

Fifteen Bangladeshi boys, who were trafficked to India at different times, returned home through Hili immigration point in Hakimpur upazila of the district yesterday.  
The returnees are Mohidul Islam, 14, son of Bareque Ali, Md Manik, 14, son of Rezaul Haque, Jhantu Mia, 15, son of Nur Mohammad, and Ashraf Mollah, 15, son of Mosharraf Hossain of Kusthia district; Kartik Kumar, 14, son of Sudhir Chandra Roy, 9, son of Swasti Chandra Roy of Kurigram district; Momin Islam, 14, son Ataur Rahman of Gaibandha district; Russel Mia, 13, son of Suruj Mia of Sunamganj district; Rana Sheikh, 11, son of Mojibar Sheikh of Jessore district; Refat Hossain Anar, 14, son of Mujibur Rahman; Foysal Khan, 15, son of Amzad Khan; and Md Swapan, 12, son of Anwar Hossain of Dhaka district; Zillur Rahman, 15, son of Jashim Uddin of Chuadanga district; Abinash Chandra Roy, 14, son of Monosh Chandra

Roy of Thakurgaon district; and Saiful Halder, 15, son of Rostam Halder of Bogra district.  
Indian Immigration Officer Md Nasir Hossain handed over the boys to his Bangladesh counterpart Md Rafiquzzaman Rafiq at noon. Officials of Border Guard Bangladesh (BGB) and Border Security Force (BSF) of India were also present there.  
Md Nasir Hossain told

local journalists that Indian police and BSF personnel arrested the boys from different areas in India soon after they were taken there three year ago by a gang of human traffickers.  
Later, the boys were sent to Suwayan Observation Centre in Balurghat under Dakkhin Dinajpur of West Bengal.  
Bangladesh National Women Lawyers' Association and Justice and

Care of India jointly took initiatives to get the trafficked boys back to Bangladesh. Representatives of both organisations were also present at Hili Immigration point yesterday.  
Immigration officer Rafiq said he received the boys and handed them over to their parents. "It was a very emotional moment when they met with their families," he added.
