#### Two more Fast & Furious films announced

Universal Pictures and Vin Diesel have confirmed there will be a ninth and a 10th film in its "Fast and Furious" franchise with release dates in 2019 and 2021.

The news was first unveiled late Tuesday night through Vin Diesel's Instagram account. Diesel had revealed on January 18 that eighth film would be titled "Fast 8" and released the first poster for the action movie, showing the New York City skyline.

Universal had already staked out April 14, 2017, as the release date for "Fast 8". Diesel and Universal both said Tuesday that "Fast & Furious 9" will open on April 19, 2019,



with "Fast & Furious 10" coming April 2, 2021. "Fast & Furious 10" is the first title to be given a specific date in 2021.

Plot details have yet to be revealed for "Fast 8" although news broke last month that Universal was exploring shooting the actioner in Cuba. "Straight Outta Compton" director F Gary Gray is directing and Neil Moritz is producing with Diesel.

"Furious 7," which was dedicated to the late Paul Walker, was a massive success with worldwide grosses topping \$1.5 billion.

#### DAS 2016 Press Conference held

Summit as chief guest while Civil

Dhaka takes its turn to become a hub of art, as the third edition of Dhaka Art Summit (DAS) sets off tomorrow. Thanks to the magnanimous initiative by Samdani Art Foundation, a number of Bangladeshi artists (65% of the total participants) are getting a rare opportunity to showcase their works alongside big names of contemporary art from South Asian countries and beyond. Art lovers, connoisseurs and

organisers from across the world are looking forward to see the proceedings of all-around artistic expressions and arrangement that the world's largest non-commercial and research-based exhibition platform for South Asian Art is offering in a four-day (February 5-8) grand art fiesta from 10am to 9pm daily.

Art connoisseur and Finance Minister AMA Muhith will inaugurate the biennale Dhaka Art

Aviation and Tourism Minister Rashed Khan Menon and Cultural Affairs Minister Asaduzzaman Noor will attend the ceremony as special guests. On the other hand, Civil Aviation and Tourism Ministry has started a campaign called "Visit Bangladesh 2016", as Bangladesh government marks 2016 as the year of tourism. Produced by Samdani Art Foundation, the grand art summit is being organised by Samdani Art Foundation in association with Ministry of Cultural Affairs, Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA), Bangladesh Tourism Board and over 50 international partners. of the event.

Among others, Rajeeb Samdani, Co-Founder of SAF; Zakir Hai, COO of Golden Harvest and artistcurator Mohammad Muniruzzaman were present.

"For 2016, there will be 17 solo projects curated by the SAF's artistic director Diana Campbell Betancourt. Other content includes five curated exhibitions, eight durational performances, a film programme, panel discussion, and book launches. To grow DAS as a research platform, we invited curators from different institutions like Tate Modern, Centre Pompidou, the Guggenheim, and the Kunsthalle Zürich to extend their research deeper into South Asia. Works from the National Gallery archive, National Museum of Bangladesh, and various private collections will also be on display at the exhibition," mentioned Nadia Samdani.

Following a QA session, the organisers directed a guided tour for the journalists.

#### "Writing is a third profession in our country" ... Anisul Hoque

Noted litterateur and journalist, Anisul Hoque has won several awards, including the Bangla Academy Award for his outstanding works. Some of his books will be published at this year's Ekushey Boi Mela. In a recent conversation with The Daily Star, the celebrated writer talked about the book fair, his upcoming books and busy professional life.

How many of your books are being published at the fair? Anisul Hoque: Two novels -- "Lift-e

Atka Pora Jubok Jubotira" and "General O Narigan". I'm still writing the latter. Besides this, a book named "Prithibir Rupoboti Nari Apnar Jonno" and others on teenagers are to be published.

When did you publish your first book? Anisul Hoque: In 1989. It was a poetry book named "Khola Chithi Sundorer Kachhe". I

was a student of BUET back then. We published the book ourselves. It earned me much acclaim.

What are your expectations from this fair?

Anisul Hoge: As the country's political situation remains stable, I'm very hopeful about the fair this time as a writer. I hope that a good number of readers will throng the fair to browse through books. I also hope that proper security arrangements are in place. With all this, I think we will see a good fair this year.

You are used to writing fiction, but what is your favourite reading material?

Anisul Hoge: Columns and memoirs. Apart from this, poetry books also attract me.

You often write satires. When did you first start such writing? Anisul Hoque: I have been writing a satire column for newspapers for the last 27 years. One of my humour books named "Koutuk Toutuk" will be brought out this fair.

When do you usually concentrate on writing?

Anisul Hoque: In the morning, I start writing after I have my morning cup of

tea and go through the newspaper. But if I skip writing any morning, I don't sit down to write the rest of the day.

What is the life as a writer like? Anisul Hoque: I would like to spend the rest of my life writing. But writing is the third profession in our country. You have to spend a lot of time for this besides maintaining your family and job.

What else do

you enjoy, besides writing? Anisul Hoque: Drawing, enjoying movies and listening to music. Cricket also entertains me a great deal.

Tell us about your bestselling book "Maa"? Anisul Hoque: The novel is based on a true story. It is a story based on the life of Shaheed Azad. The 60th edition of this book has been published. Over one lakh copies of this book have been sold till now. It has been published in English from Delhi and Orissa. The book is also published in Swedish and

The five-day Crafts Fair will commence on



Golden Globe-winning Hollywood blockbuster "The Revenant" is all set to debut in Dhaka. The action-adventure will premiere at Star Cineplex in the capital's Bashundhara City this evening, and will be screened from Friday.

Academy-Award winning director Alejandro G. Iñárritu's latest film has won Best Picture Award at the Golden Globes 2016. The film is also leading Oscar nominations, with a staggering 12 nominations including Best Picture, Best Director, Best Actor and Best Supporting Actor.
