Man gets life for raping girl after abduction

Another jailed for two years in dowry case

A court here yesterday sentenced a man to life term rigorous imprisonment for raping a 13-year-old school-girl after abduction in 2008.

The convict, Monsur-Rasul Rubel, is a resident of Betua village in Daganbhuiyan upazila of the district, reports a correspondent.

Additional District and Sessions Judge Nilufar Sultana delivered the judgement in the presence of Rubel. He was later sent to prison.

The court also fined him Tk 20,000. In default he is to suffer one year more in jail.

According to the prosecution, Rubel abducted the girl, a Class VII student of Daganbhuiyan Girls' School, on her way to the school in January 12, 2008.

Rubel took the girl to Chittagong, confined her to a house and raped her, according to the statement of the girl recorded in the court.

Victim's father lodged a case with Daganbhuiyan Police Station the following day.

Police arrested Rubel and rescued the girl from Chittagong after 4/5 days of the incident.

After investigation, police pressed charges

against Rubel the same year.

Away in Chandpur, A court here yesterday sentenced a man to two years' imprisonment for torturing his wife for dowry at Ibrahimpur village under Sadar upazila in 2011, according to our correspondent.

The convict is Monu Majhi, 32, son of late Arshad Ali of the village. Judge Ramani Ranjan Chakma of Women and Children Repression Prevention Tribunal, Chandpur, pronounced the verdict in the afternoon.

According to the prosecution, Arshad had been demanding Tk 50,000 from

his father-in-law as dowry for long. He locked in an altercation with his wife Ayesha Begum, 20, over the issue on the night of November 11, 2011. At one stage Arshad beat up Ayesha, leaving her seriously injured.

Ayesha's father Osman Miji of the same village took his daughter to Chandpur Sadar Hospital the following day and filed a case with Chandpur Model Police Station on November 25, accusing Monu Majhi.

After examining the case record and witnesses, the judge punished Monu Majhi.

Robber hurt in gunfight with cops

A robber was injured during a gunfight between a gang of robbers and police on Joypurhat-Bogra highway in Akkelpur upazila of Joypurhat district on Tuesday night, police said.

Police arrested the bullet-hit robber from a bamboo cluster beside the road at Adivasipara in the upazila. The arrestee is Md Sabu Rahman, 38, son of Matbar Ali of Rajosh village under Gobindaganj upazila of Gaibandha district.

Police said a gang of around 10 robbers intercepted three minibuses and three motorcycles on the road in the area at around 10:30pm and looted money and other valuables from the passengers.

Being informed, a police patrol team went to the spot. Sensing the presence of the policemen, robbers opened fire, prompting the law enforcers to retaliate. Sabu sustained bullets wounds while other members of the gang managed to flee.

bKash man robbed of Tk 5.2 lakh

Muggers shot a trader while snatching Tk 5.2 lakh from a sales representative of bKash at Narsingdi Bazar in Sadar upazila yesterday.

Bullet-hit Kajal Paul, 23, is now undergoing treatment at Narsingdi Sadar Hospital.

Babul Sarkar, president of the bazaar managing committee, said a gang led by Russel waylaid bKash sales representative Hamdul Islam Sohag while he was going to a nearby bank to deposit Tk 5.2 lakh.

The gang took away the bag containing the money and tried to flee the scene, firing gunshots. Kajal received bullet-wounds in his leg.

SSC EXAMS UNDER DINAJPUR BOARD

Seven teachers expelled for allowing unfair means

Seven teachers performing duty at three SSC examination centres in Gobindaganj upazila under Gaibandha district were expelled on the second day of the examinations yesterday for allowing a few examinees to exchange

question papers illegally.

The expelled teachers are Radhikanath Gun, AKM Shamsul Alam Mollah, Azadul Islam, Meria Parvin and Abdul Aziz, working at Nakaihat High School centre, Ujjal Kumar at Rampura BL High School, and Khokon Chandra Sarker at Harirampur High

School in Gobindaganj upazila.

These teachers were expelled as they allowed eight students to exchange their question papers at the centres during the Bangla second paper examination yesterday, said Tofazzur Rahman, controller of examinations of Dinajpur

Kaliganj mayor in Jhenidah sent to jail in arms case

A Jhenidah court yesterday sent Mustafizur Rahman Biju, 44, mayor of Kaliganj municipality under the district, and also a member of the central Juba League, and Abdus Samad Milton, 52, an activist of Juba League Kaliganj unit, to jail in an arms case.

They appeared before the Court of Judicial Magistrate SM Moniruzzaman in the afternoon and sought bail.

The court rejected their bail petitions and sent them to jail.

According to the case statement, a group of local Awami League (AL) men attacked Biju's house on December 2 over doing construction work in the municipality. The mayor fired eight rounds of bullets from his licensed revolver in self-defence.

The incident took place following rivalry between two groups of the AL in the upazila.

The rivals were also engaged in a clash which led to chase and counter-chase for hours.


On the same night, Anisur Rahman, a Juba League leader, filed a case against 15 people, mentioning Biju as the main accused, with Kaliganj Police Station.

Sub-Inspector Nirob Hossain of the police station also filed another case against the mayor and Abdus Samad Milton under
