## Saudi moves 'jets, troops' to Turkey

Ground ops in Syria possible, says Turkish FM; Ankara hits Kurds in Aleppo; Russia sees 'new Cold War'

Turkey and Saudi Arabia could launch a ground operation against Islamic State jihadists in Syria, the Turkish foreign minister said yesterday, as Russian prime minister said the simmering East-West tension has plunged the world into a "new Cold War". The coordinated plans by Riyadh and Ankara, who are

pursuing an increasingly tight alliance, add a new element to the explosive situation in Syria where Russia has been backing a successful regime offensive against rebels. In another development, Turkish artillery yesterday

bombarded areas of Aleppo province in northern Syria controlled by Kurdish forces, the Syrian Observatory for Human Rights said. The monitoring group's head, Rami Abdel Rahman, said

Turkish shelling struck areas of Aleppo, including Minnigh, recently taken by the Kurdish People's Protection Units (YPG) militia from Islamist rebels. Britain's daily Independent reported that Saudi Arabia

was sending troops and fighter jets to Turkey's Incirlik military base ahead of a possible ground invasion of Syria.

The Turkish foreign minister, Mevlut Cavusoglu, confirmed the deployment in a statement to the Yeni Şafak newspaper yesterday.

bKash agents shot, Tk 13 lakh looted

Another stabbed to death in Tangail Friday night

Muggers ran away with Tk 13 lakh after shooting two sales representatives of bKash at Kafrul in the capital yesterday morning.

In another incident, assailants killed an agent of the mobile banking service provider while snatching Tk 1 lakh from him in Tangail Sadar upazila on Friday night.

The sales representatives -- Mosharraf Hossain, 33, and Al-Amin, 22, -- were undergoing treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital, said Sentu Chandra Das, assistant subinspector of DMCH Police

Mosharraf was shot five times in the hands while Al-Amin once in the backside, he added.

Zainal Abedin, manager of AID bKash Distribution where the victims work, said the incident happened around 10:30am when the two staff were returning to their office at Mirpur 14 on a motorcycle.

Legendary music composer Robin Ghosh passed away at a city hospital yesterday. He was 79.


