Negative remarks don't lead to national unity

Gonoforum President Dr Kamal Hossain yesterday said it is not possible to build national unity through making negative remarks. Those people who do not believe in national unity always make these kinds of comments, he said.

"As a conscious citizen, I may have some questions. But the fact is that with the negative remarks we can't build the unity again in the country.....It is usual that the government may make mistakes. We should criticise all in a decent way," he said.

He was speaking at a publication ceremony of a book tilled, "Bangladesher Shadhinata Judhe Dhakhinachal," written by freedom fighter Md Nurul Islam Manzu, at Jatiya Press Club.

Dr Kamal said if the government takes its position against the unity, all should notice that it is doing wrong. There is no example of failure of any united movement in Bangladesh as well as in the world, he added. He said the Liberation War of Bangladesh was a united fight from all sections of the people and no one can ignore their role. "There is no village in the country where you don't find any grave or mass grave of the people who

country," said Kamal.

Help pry schools Rab in capital be tech savvy

PM urges affluent, says most hill tracts schools will be turned residential

Stressing the importance of digital education, Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday urged the affluent of the society to come up with support like providing multimedia projectors and laptops to primary schools of their respective areas.

"I hope they will donate to schools as gifts and this is my ardent call to the nation," she said.

Hasina was addressing a function while inaugurating the "Primary Education Content; Conversion to Inter-Active Multimedia Digital Version" programme held at her office in the capital.

"Some 1,500 multimedia classrooms have been set up and some 5,000 laptops have been provided, aiming to flourish the operations of multimedia classrooms. It is not so tough to have at least one multimedia classroom in 63,601 primary schools across the country," she said.

Hasina said the government gives greater importance to technology-based education.

"We will take our steps from the government. But all have to come up with self-initiatives...education can free a country from poverty," she stressed.

She emphasised, "The lessons should be more attractive for students and schools should have an encouraging environ ment. Also parents should not exert too much pressure them."

Most schools in the hilly areas of the Chittagong Hil Tracts will be turned into residential ones for the convenience of students, Hasina reiterated. The aim of Inter-Active Multimedia Digital Version | drive and arrested Aminul.

programme is to prepare interactive and multimedia based content of 17 books in Bangla, English, Mathematics, Science, Bangladesh and World Affairs in light with the curriculum of primary education framed by the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB). kinds of pictures, charts, diagrams, audio, video and other multimedia components and thus presenting those through animation for making the contents more attractive and easily perceivable.

Cry for justice still being heard on campus

he had caught on having to take up residence on a corridor of the hall.

On top of that, he was compelled to keep standing for nearly four hours in the freezing cold at night on January 26 as part of a "guestroom duty" despite informing "senior Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) brothers" of his illness, they added.

Fresher say this "guestroom duty" is a regular session where BCL leaders brief activists on political activities and analyse them.

Yesterday, Progotishil Chhatra Jote and Samrajjobad Birodhi Chhatra Oikkya, joined by non-affiliated students, brought out a procession and staged a rally on the campus with a banner reading, "Stop student's harassments at guestrooms and ensure their security". They, along with some political party leaders who were

present to express solidarity and others on social media, demanded trial of the accused BCL men and termed the death a result of a trend of "harassment at guestrooms". "The democratic culture is being destroyed through this

kind of guestroom harassment," said Bangladesh Chhatra Union President Lucky Akter. "The pro-ruling party student organisation has created an atmosphere of anarchy in the campus compelling stu-

dents of all dormitories to follow their command. The university administration never stands for all, rather supports the ruling power," she said.

President of Samajtantrik Chhatra Front Saifuzzaman Sakon claimed, "As Hafijur is a son of an auto-rickshaw driver, an ordinary poor man, Hafijur's death is not even

being considered as a death."

Jatiya Mukti Council General Secretary Faizul Hakim Lala

said, "BCL is grabbing students' freedom of speech and to think and is strengthening their domination through a seat allocation
