The 23-year-old Aurier continued to insult his teammates, including Angel di Maria, whom he called a "clown".

The right-back has responded that the video was fake and old, but comments on the live feed referencing Valentine's Day suggest that it was posted on Saturday night.

Canal+ columnist Pierre Menes tweeted that Aurier was "going to deny the claims and take legal action concerning the falsification of a video".

as she hugged five-time world amateur champion Mary Kom at the end of the semifinal fight in 48-51kg category of the South Asian Games at the SAI-SAG Centre in Shillong yesterday.

There was no doubt about Shamima's defeat at the hands Olympic bronze medallist Mary Kom; the question was how many minutes the 17-year-old could stand against the 32-year-old boxer. The class-IX student from Jessore fought for nearly four minutes before expressing her unwillingness to continue, with 14 seconds left to end of the second round.

Shamima, who started playing boxing in 2014 and confirmed her semifinal against Mary after getting a bye in the Mary, who often instigated the total of four bronze medals from box-

Bangladeshi girl to punch her but the 17-year-old could hardly dare to remove her hands from her face.

"I was not afraid of her rather I wanted to play full four rounds without thinking about the result," said Shamima over phone from Shillong.


