

# Trade union in EPZs gets nod

4.4 lakh workers of 453 factories to get the rights as cabinet gives final approval to draft law

The cabinet yesterday finally gave the nod to the draft Bangladesh EPZ Labour Law 2016, with provisions for forming legal trade unions in factories inside of the Export Processing Zones (EPZ).

Allowing trade unions in factories was the last of the 16 conditions set by the US to be fulfilled by the Bangladesh government for regaining the GSP (Generalised System of Preferences) in the US market.

Bangladesh government has already submitted the progress report on the implementation of 16 conditions to the United States Trade Representative (USTR), the chief trade negotiation body for the US government, for reinstatement of the GSP privilege.

The GSP was suspended for Bangladesh in June, 2013, due to serious shortcomings in workplace safety and labour rights.

Apart from suspending the GSP benefit after the Rana Plaza building collapse, the US government gave the 16 conditions as "Bangladesh Action Plan".

The government made delays in allowing unions in the EPZs, as the foreign investors were divided on the issue. Investors of some countries said the unions would hamper the production while others argued that the unions would establish labour rights.

If this draft, which amends EPZ Workers' Welfare and Industrial Relations Act, 2010, is passed by parliament and made into law, the Workers' Welfare Associations (WWA) in factories inside of the EPZs would act as the legal trade unions.



### Case spree on 35 COUNTING

Star editor faces 17 more defamation suits, sedition charges

Seventeen more cases, including six for sedition, were filed against The Daily Star Editor and Publisher Mahfuz Anam in 17 districts yesterday.

With these cases, he faces 35 lawsuits so far. Eight of them are complaints seeking to sue the editor for sedition while the rest are defamation suits.

The galore of lawsuits comes days after the Star editor at a talk show on February 3 made

an introspective comment about a lapse in his editorial judgement in publishing a few reports based on information given by the Taskforce Interrogation Cell during the 2007-08 caretaker government without being able to verify them independently.

Following yesterday's defamation suits, four courts in Rangpur, Chapainawabganj, Khagrachhari and Natore summoned Mahfuz Anam to appear before them on March 1, April 28, March 16 and March 30

### ABDUCTION FOR RANSOM Boy rescued from Gazipur

Detectives arrested two alleged kidnappers and rescued a fiveyear-old boy in Gazipur on Sunday, around one and a half months after his abduction from the capital's Uttara area.

The arrestees are Abdul Jabbar and his wife Nazma Begum. Jabbar abducted Mobarak, son of Mohammad Faruk, a fruit vendor, from in front of his house in Uttara's sector-9 on December 29 last year while he was playing, said detectives.

The abductors kept the boy confined to Nazma's house at Mauna in Gazipur. Jabbar had been demanding Tk 5 lakh as ransom for the boy's release.

They had frequently threatened over the phone about

killing the boy if the family informed police. Jabbar was arrested from the home of his another wife Selina at Saghata in Gaibandha on Sunday, said Monirul Islam, additional commissioner of Dhaka Metropolitan

## SQ Chy's wife, son indicted

A Dhaka court yesterday framed charges against the wife and son of executed war criminal Salauddin Quader Chowdhury and five others for allegedly leaking the draft verdict of the International Crimes Tribunal-1 that sentenced him to death.

The ICT-1 on October 1, 2013, had awarded capital punishment to the BNP leader for committing crimes against humanity during the Liberation War.

The seven accused are: Salauddin's wife Farhat Quader Chowdhury, son Humam Quader Chowdhury, manager Mahbubul Ahsan, counsel Fakhrul Islam, Fakhrul's assistant Mehedi Hasan, the tribunal's then office assistant Faruk Hossain and peon Nayan Ali.

Of them, Farhat, Humam, Fakhrul and Ahsan are on bail, Faruk and Nayan behind bars while Mehedi has been on the
