
'Deadpool' makes history at BO

Ryan Reynolds' superhero movie 'Deadpool' is obliterating numerous records over the weekend, while it opens to a resounding \$132.1 million overseas for a global bow of \$282.1 million; 'Zoolander 2' stum-

In a sea change for Hollywood's go-to genre — comic book adaptations — the R-rated and irreverent 'Deadpool' grossed a recordbreaking \$132.7 million over the weekend, one of the best showings of all time for a superhero movie and shattering all expectations.

The Marvel-branded film is an enormous victory for Fox and Reynolds, who spent more than a decade convincing the studio to let him make the X-Men spinoff his way. Fox finally said yes but kept the budget at a relatively modest \$58 million. Every other studio superhero movie in recent times has been rated PG-13 and cost much more; but 'Deadpool' altered the

The Nata-Pala is performed throughout the year at important festivals and at significant "rites-of-passage" in an individual's life. It also serves as a common prologue to the performance of the Rasa-Lila. The 'natapala' of Manipuris of Bangladesh is sung in Bangla. This particular 'nata-pala' depicts Sri Radha's unremitting devotion towards her divine Lord, Krishna.

Shadhona will be staging this production in Dhaka tonight, (February 17) at 6:30 pm at the Chhayanaut Cultural Centre, before the 16 member dance troupes leaves for Khajuraho on February 19. Shadhona's Artistic Director is leading the team. She is also presenting an academic paper on dance practices in Bangladesh at the Seminar organised within the Khajuraho Festival.



these five legends, the name of Khandaker Nurul Alam was an obvious choice. The others were Abdul Ahad, Khan Ataur Rahman, Satya Saha and Robin Ghosh. Khandaker Nurul Alam and Robin Ghosh were still alive and we decided to invite them to the programme. I personally went to the residence of Khandaker Nurul Alam to invite him to the programme; that was my first meeting with the maestro. I knew he was paralysed but at my first meeting I was quite shocked to see him in a wheel chair. I had the impression that his health was steadily going downhill. His wife gave me his photograph and filled me in with other details about him. We were told that he could not attend our programme, however Robin Ghosh, the only other surviving composer (who passed away on February 13) graced the programme. After the programme I went to see Alam again and returned the photographs and gave him our brochure. Alam was very happy to see me. That was my last opportunity to meet him.

Khandaker Nurul Alam was born in Assam but after partition, their family came to settle in the-then East Pakistan. He did his matriculation from Noakhali Zilla School along with another legendary lyricist of the country KG Mostafa. Both of them met again at Dhaka University and shared many unbounded memories of the beginning of their music career. He was not only a great music composer, but also a very good singer, teacher and mentor.

Khandaker Nurul Alam is no more with us now, but his musical work, commitment, dedication and his outstanding personality will remain alive in the history of Bangla music for many years to come. His all time great songs "Chokh Je Moner Kotha Bole", "Ek Boroshar Brishtitey Bhije", "Eto Shukh Shoibo Kemon Kore", "Ami Chand Ke Bolechhi Aj Ratey", "Ke Jeno Aj Amar Chokhe" and "Janam Janam Dhore Prem Piyashi" will always symbolise the melodious Bangla songs of the golden era of the 1960s-80s.


