#### Carlos takes a swipe at Barca

Real Madrid would have been heavily criticised for attempting Lionel Messi's trick penalty, according to Roberto Carlos.

The Barcelona star's

decision to roll his spot-kick sideways to allow Luis Suarez to complete his hattrick in the 6-1 rout of Celta Vigo has triggered significant debate in recent days.

Both Celta boss Eduardo Berizzo and Barcelona coach Luis Enrique have defended Messi from accusations of disrespect for his opponents, though a handful of players from across Europe have criticised the incident.

And former Madrid fullback Roberto Carlos has little doubt that such a penalty at the Santiago Bernabeu would have received widespread condemnation.

"If we did that Messi penalty at the Bernabeu, it's a lack of respect," he told Cadena SER's 'El Larguero'.

The veteran also took a swipe at Barca by suggesting that they, unlike Madrid, rely far too heavily on their attacking trident of Messi, Suarez and Neymar.

# Roma plot Real upset

The prospect of spoiling Zinedine Zidane's Champions League coaching debut with Real Madrid may be formidable, but Roma midfielder Seydou Keita believes his side can upset the 10-time record champions in their last 16, first leg clash.

"How we line up against them is down to the coach, but for me, we have to believe in ourselves and go on the pitch convinced," said the Malian ahead of Wednesday's tie in Rome's Stadio Olimpico.

Former Barcelona midfielder Keita knows his opponents well having won 11 matches with the Catalans in the 17 times he played against the arch Liga rivals.

"This game will be difficult, but not impossible," added Keita of Real's miserable record against Italian teams in the competition. Roma coach Luciano Spalletti, brought back to the club

was at the helm when the Italians prevailed over two legs in 2008. Roma beat Real 2-1 at home, a score they would repeat at the Santiago Bernabeu before being humbled 3-0 by even-

recently following the sacking of Frenchman Rudi Garcia,

tual winners Manchester United in the quarter-finals. Real have made it to the semi-finals of the competition the past five seasons, claiming their historic 10th title, 'La Decima', in 2014 when current manager Zidane was assis-

tant to Carlo Ancelotti. Efforts to go one step further last year were rebuffed when Juventus claimed a 2-1 win in Turin and booked their final place against Barcelona thanks to a 1-1 draw at the Bernabeu.

But there is little chance Zidane is entertaining another early exit and the former France and Juventus great comes to Rome with only one defeat from his six-game tenure so far, during which Real have scored 23 goals.

Despite it being his Champions League debut as coach, Zidane's past experience in the competition gives him the knowledge of what it takes to succeed in Europe's premier club competition.

"When you're a player, you dream of playing in the World Cup, but you can dream of the Champions League every year," said Zidane.

"We are prepared and we want to do something important in this competition."

Although Welsh winger Gareth Bale remains sidelined with a calf strain, Real welcomed left-back Marcelo, who missed a 4-2 win over Athletic Bilbao at the weekend due to a a dislocated shoulder, back to their matchday squad.

With central defender Pepe sidelined, Raphael Varane will keep his place alongside Sergio Ramos despite being sent off in a poor display at the weekend.

# Neymar's assets frozen

Brazilian authorities have blocked assets of Barcelona star Neymar, including a yacht, a jet and several

properties worth almost \$50 million. A Sao Paulo federal court rejected

an appeal from the Brazilian striker last week and started issuing warrants to freeze the assets worth 192 million reals (almost \$50 million), Brazilian media reported on Monday.

Last year, Neymar, his family and related businesses were found guilty of evading 63 million reals in taxes (almost \$16 million) between 2011 and 2013 when he was playing for Brazilian club Santos. He has denied any wrongdoing.

The 23-year-old Neymar used the jet to travel to Brazil for World Cup qualifying matches and holidays. Iagaro Jung Martins, an auditor

with Brazil's federal tax agency, told isn't likely to go to jail if he pays what regulators say he owes. "He can still appeal that decision,

but it is a step forward," Martins told the AP. "Nothing changed to what was in place last year: if he pays what he owes, the case is closed. Our legislation isn't too harsh." The assets seizure is the latest in a

streak of bad news for the Brazilian star off the pitch.

On February 2 Neymar and his father were questioned for three hours in a Madrid court about the player's transfer to Barcelona. The

case was brought by Grupo Sonda, which invested in Neymar early in his career and was allegedly entitled to 40 per cent of the total transfer amount.

Barcelona maintains the deal cost The Associated Press that Neymar the club 57.1 million euros (then \$74 million). Santos officially received a payment of 17.1 million euros (\$18.5 million), with the remaining 40 million euros (\$55.5 million) going to a company owned by Neymar's father, Neymar Santos. But investigations in Spain later showed that Barcelona spent nearly 83.3 million euros (\$90 million) to acquire Neymar.

Former and current Barcelona presidents and representatives of Santos were also questioned. The Brazilian club also claims to have been hurt by the transfers. All parties denied any wrongdoing.

### Blatter appears before appeals committee

Disgraced FIFA president Sepp Blatter appeared before a FIFA's appeals committee on Tuesday to fight an eight-year ban from the sport for ethics violations.

Blatter arrived at FIFA headquarters in Zurich 90 minutes before the start of the hearing at 0800

His hearing follows a similar appeal by the fallen head of European football, Michel Platini, on Monday.

Blatter and Platini were banned by FIFA's ethics committee in December after being found guilty of breaches surrounding a mysterious 2 million Swiss franc (\$2 million, 1.8 million euros) payment Platini received from Blatter in 2011.

Both men, once the most powerful figures in world football, have insisted that the payment was part of a legitimate oral contract reportedly for consulting work performed by Platini a decade earlier.

The notorious 2011 payment is also part of a criminal probe by Swiss prosecutors targeting Blatter, in which Platini has been questioned in a capacity that falls between a witness and an accused person. Blatter and Platini have been the most high-profile casu-

alties in the unprecedented, wide-ranging scandal that has seen senior football executives suspended or fired, with 39 people indicted for corruption by the United States. The saga has provoked endless discussion about the com-

plicated relationship between Blatter and Platini, who previously were allies before the relationship turned publicly sour. As the two men fight to preserve their football careers, the campaign to replace Blatter is heating up with the vote 10 days away.
