He said, "The health sector achieved a lot of success, our hospitals are well-equipped with updated technologies but we do not have the specialised hospitals for AIDSaffected people yet."

Besides, there are seven more medical college hospitals across the country where people can have free HIV detection test, the minister added.

The Chittagong University (CU) authority on Friday night filed three cases over the three recent incidents of vandalism on CU campus.

CU Registrar (acting) Prof Kamrul Huda filed the cases with Hathazari Police Station accusing 10 persons by name and 80 unnamed people over the incidents which occurred on February 4, 8 and 9, said Officer-in-Charge Md Ismail.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) activist Fasiual Rahman Sonet and 25 others are accused in one case filed over the vandalism of a door and six windows of the physics department on February 4 after an academic committee denied taking a special exam for a course they had failed earlier.

Six BCL activists, Arafat Hossain, Bayezid Sajal, Imtiaz Uddin Chowdhury, Istiak Ahmed Tanvir, Arafatul Islam and Mahmudul Islam, and 30 others are accused in another case filed over the vandalism of several rooms during fighting among BCL groups at Shah Amanat Hall on February 8.

The third case was filed over the vandalism of several rooms of Suhrawardy Hall in a similar BCL clash on February 9 accusing three persons by name, including Arafatul, and 25 unnamed.

### 3 cases filed over Move to import 500MW vandalism at CU more power from India

BSS, Dhaka

By enhancing capacity of power grids connecting Bangladesh and India, the government has taken an initiative to import 500 more megawatts (MW) of electricity from India by June 2018. "A project 'Enhancing Capacity of

Existing Bangladesh (Bheramara)-India (Bahorompur) Grid Interconnection (500MW)' is under implementation," State Minister for Power, Energy and Mineral Resources Nasrul Hamid told the news agency.

The government will construct a highvoltage direct current (HVDC) station having a capacity of 500MW under the project, which will require two years, he said.

Currently Bangladesh is importing 500MW from India, he added.

He said the government had set a target to generate 24,000MW of electricity by 2021, and 40,000MW by 2030 aimed at providing electricity to every citizen.

According to a ministry official, the government has a plan for achieving energy efficiency in the near future by implementing all mega projects. However, load shedding was almost an everyday phenomenon a few years ago to the utter sufferings of all people across the country, but today electricity failure is seldom seen anywhere in both urban and rural areas.

The government has already provided power connection to around 3 crore people by introducing 42,000km of new lines and capacity enhancement by 1,798MW in the last two years (2014 to 2015), he said.

The government has set a target to generate 24,000MW of electricity, 53 percent of which will be sourced from coal, within "Vision 2021". With this end in view, he said, the government increased the number of power plants, transmission lines and distribution lines for rapid economic growth to help Bangladesh become a middle income country by 2021.

#### EC to print record number of ballots for UP polls

The Election Commission (EC) has started printing some 22 crore ballot papers required for the upcoming six-phase Union Parishad elections, which is the largest printing task in the country's election history.

Over seven-crore ballot papers will be required for chairman election in 4,275 union parishads and some 15 crore more for member posts and reserved seats (for women), said officials at EC Secretariat.

The six-phase UP election is set to begin on March 22 with balloting in some 740 UPs in the first phase.

Unlike the 2011 UP election, the commission will not be able to print ballot papers against the chairman posts before the list of candidature is finalised as this time the chairman election is being held along party line.

The commission will only get 13-14 days to print ballot papers for the chairman post in each phase of the election after the last

date for withdrawal of candidature and it will take 3-4 more days to distribute those papers across the country, said a deputy secretary at the EC Secretariat. The ballot papers for each chairman post

will be different as the papers will be inscribed with symbols of political parties and independent candidates of the particular UP, he told the news agency.

"Printing and distribution of over 700 different types of ballot papers for chairman posts within 13-14 days is a difficult task... they initially started printing some six-crore last week for member posts and reserved seats," he said.

The ballot papers will be of three different colours. White for chairman posts, green and pink for member posts and reserved seats respectively, and are being printed in five printing presses, including BG Press, Government Printing Press and Security Printing Press, said EC officials.
