Indian Air Force Chief Arup Raha in town

Indian Air Force Chief Arup Raha arrived in Dhaka yesterday on a five-day official visit to Bangladesh.

Diplomatic sources said the visit, till February 25, is intended to take the existing defence cooperation between the armed forces of the two countries to the next level.

The areas of cooperation at present include exchange in military training courses, exchange of visits and joint sporting activities, they said.

During his stay, Air Chief Marshal Raha, who is also chairman of the chiefs of staff committee of the Indian Defence Forces, is scheduled to hold bilateral discussions with the three SEE PAGE 11 COL 4

embassy's staff paid their homage to those who sacrificed their lives to preserve the Bangla language, and wished the people of the country saying "Amar Ekushey" (Immortal 21st) in their respective mother tongues.

Many American employees of the embassy grew up speaking a language other than English, typical in a country with rich and diverse

Create colourful letters at Prothom Alo's Bornomela 2016

Drawn, coloured, painted and formed with clay by little hands, Bangla letters got hundreds of designs and shapes at the Sultana Kamal Women's Sports Complex in the capital yesterday.

From the morning till evening, children with their friends and parents crowded the place celebrating their love for the mother tongue at the Bornomela 2016 (alphabet fair), organised by Bangla daily Prothom Alo in association with Unilever's brand Surf Excel, on International Mother Language Day.

Six-year-old Sadia Hasan Cynthia had red paint on both her hands. "I am colouring 'Aw' (the first letter of the Bangla alphabet)," she said, while pressing her hand on the huge white letter made from cardboard.

"I drew our national flag and flowers on Tshirts and wrote Bangla letters on the kite," she said. As she gave an account of her busy day at the fair, her mother standing beside informed how

Cynthia had been waiting for this day since she attended this event last year.

The fair, organised for the seventh time, engages people mostly children with the world of Bangla letters through songs, games, painting and handwriting competitions and puppet and muppet shows. Celebrities, writers, and singers spend time with the kids introducing the alphabets to them.

The event was also held in Rajshahi and Chittagong yesterday.

The fair at Dhaka was inaugurated by actress Joya Ahsan, writer Shahnaz Munni, and gold medal winning weight-lifter in South Asian Games 2016 Mabia Akhter Simanta.

Tashinur Rahman, student of class-II of an English medium school, came to the fair with his mother. He was looking for a T-shirt he painted, at a stall by Surf Excel, which offered a chance to children to paint designs on white T-shirts, out of which the best ones were awarded.

"I drew a flag and the letters," he said, explaining what February 21st signifies. "I can read

Bangla but not fluently," he said, adding that he went to the book fair with his mother almost every year and bought comics and story books.

At the Bornomela, the fun-filled atmosphere intrigued class-X student Mayabi Chowdhury from Uttara so much that she too dipped her hand in the paint buckets and coloured the cardboard letters. "It feels good to see people of this generation

coming here and having fun playing with Bangla letters. You only see our affection for Bangla only on occasions now," said Mayabi, adding that she and her parents would visit the Shaheed Minar afterwards. Mahmuda, Maisha, and Rifat came with their

uncle from Mohammadpur. Though teenaged, they were excited like toddlers to get on the Ferris wheel. "We came here for the first time, reading about the event in the paper," said Maisa, student of class-VII.

"We are having so much fun; we will come here again next year," said her sister Mahmuda with a grin.

She was the wife of late Shamsuzzaman Chowdhury, former chairman of Education Board, Rajshahi.

She was the daughter of Zobeda Rahim Choudhury, the first Muslim female politician of Bangladesh, and

"This toy making training will help me to make money and support my family financially," said Bina Begum, one of the trainees.

Another trainee Munni, a class-XII student, echoed her.

Last year, many women of Barisal Sadar, were given materials to make traditional shitol pati (large mats woven from cane skin), fishing nets, and start poultry farms which helped them create an alternative source of family income, Wahiduzzaman said.

of Criminology Prof Zia Rahman fell on the stairs, they added. In a Facebook status, Zia Rahman said the "attack" was "unthinkable and unacceptable". Later, some BNP men scuffled with the volunteers as the latter did not allow all of them to accompany Khaleda to the main premises of the memorial. He also denied that BNP men attacked volunteers. "It was police who attacked BNP men, leaving at least 50 people injured," he claimed.
