Outlaws active again in four SW districts

Kill 14, injure 20 others since last month

 Cadres of outlawed parties killed at least 14 people since January 1 in Kushtia, Jhenidah, Meherpur and Chuadanga districts.
 During the time, at least 20 people were injured as the outlaws blasted over 30 bombs on people, business establishments and houses.
 The victims include businessmen, lessees of local markets and water bodies, and general people who protested the outlaws' activities.
 Even two outlaws lost their lives due to rivalry among the criminals.
 The recent killings, bomb blasts and extortion by outlaws belonging to Gono Mukti Fouz (GMF), Gono Bahini, Purbo Banglar

Communist Party (PBCP-ML) and PBCP (Lal Pataka) show their attempt to resume activities in the areas, said officials of police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab).
 On February 7, PBCP-ML's men killed a cadre of its rival Lal Pataka party at Loknathpur village in Damurhuda upazila of Chuadanga.
 On February 13, 26 brick kiln owners of Chuadanga district in a press conference held at Chuadanga Press Club alleged that criminals introducing themselves as cadres of several outlawed party demanded over Tk one crore from them and threatened to kill kiln labourers by bombing if the money is not paid.

Chuadanga Sadar has remained closed following bomb attack by criminals on February 18 while outlaws demanded Tk 3 lakh each from Raisa Brick, To Ten Brick and MR Brick in Damurhuda upazila under the district on Tuesday night, said Abdul Motaleb, secretary of Chuadanga Brick Kiln Owners Association.
 Major Mosaddek Ibne Mujib, commanding officer of Rab-12, Kushtia, said the elite force has increased vigilance as outlaws have become active in some areas of Kushtia and adjacent districts.
 Two cadres of Gono Bahini were killed in an 'encounter' with Rab at Swastipur village in Kushtia Sadar upazila on February

11.
 Rab said the duo had previous criminal records including killings and recently were trying to regroup the outfit's cadres in the areas. They also killed a cadre of rival Gono Mukti Fouz by slitting his throat on January 31.
 A number of criminals who were earlier on the run have returned to their areas, especially ahead of the coming union parishad election, several people told this correspondent during his visit to different villages in Kushtia and Meherpur districts.
 Kushtia Superintendent of Police Proloy Chisim said police and other law enforcement agencies are working to check any activity of the outlaws.

Trader found dead in Patuakhali

Police recovered the body of a trader from Alipura Bazar under Kalapara upazila in the district yesterday morning.
 The deceased was identified as petrol trader Abdul Mannan Gazi, 40, of Maitebhanga village in the upazila.
 Locals found the body in the area around 7:00am and informed the police.
 The law enforcers rushed to the spot, recovered the body and sent it to Patuakhali General Hospital morgue for autopsy.
 He might have been hacked to death, said Md Moniruzzaman, in-charge of Kuakata naval outpost.

7 'outlaws' arrested in Jessore

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) arrested seven alleged outlaws with a shutter gun and four bullets in Karbala area of Jessore district town early yesterday.
 The arrestees are Ariful Islam Opu of Sujalpur Dharmatala, Hafijur Rahman Hafij of Bamanpara Karbala area, Taposh Biswas of Pashchim Barandipara Kadamtala, Shamim of the town, Hasibur Rahman of Monirampur upazila in Jessore; and Hafizur Rahman of Tala upazila in Satkhira district.
 Md Khatibur Rahman, warrant officer of Rab-6 Jessore camp, said informed that a gang was preparing to commit robbery at a house in the town the elite force raided the area and arrested the seven with the firearm and bullets around 1:00pm.

20 injured as BCL, Jubo League men clash

Eight houses, 15 shops vandalised in Chuadanga town; 3 arrested

At least 20 people were injured in a clash between the activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) and Jubo League in Chuadanga district town on Tuesday night.
 At least eight houses and 15 business establishments were also vandalised during the incident.
 The clash took place over previous enmity between Mohaimen Hasan Joarder Anik, general secretary of the district unit of BCL, and Obaidur Rahman Choudhury, former con-

vener of the district unit of Jubo League, and incumbent mayor of Chuadanga municipality.
 Criminals attacked the house of BCL activist Khalid Hasan loyal to Anik at Satgari village in Sadar upazila on Monday night. The attackers also blasted two bombs and vandalised his house, said Jasim Uddin, sub-inspector of Sadar Police Station.
 The following day, a group of BCL men allegedly led by Khalid swooped on the houses of seven Jubo League activists loyal to Obaidur Rahman Choudhury.

After the incident, both groups attacked each other, leaving 20 people from both sides injured. They also blasted around 20 bombs during the incident.
 The BCL men also vandalised at least 15 different shops of general people in the area.
 Police arrested three BCL activists from the spot. They are Abdur Rahman, 22, Sumon Hasan, 25, and Barkat Ali, 26, of Satgari village.
 Yesterday, the arrestees were produced in a court that sent them to jail, said police.

 Speedy trial tribunal Judge Golam Ahmed Khalilur Rahman also fined each of the duo Tk 5,000, in default of which they would have to stay one more year in jail, said Public Prosecutor (PP) Entajul Haque, quoting the verdict.
 Of the convicts, Shahidullah alias Mahub is the husband of a niece of executed JMB military commander Siddiqui Islam alias Bangla Bhai. The other one, Shafiullah alias Tarek, is the commander of the banned militant outfit in Rajshahi.
 The judge pronounced the verdict in their presence yesterday noon.
 Yunus, a professor of economics department, was knifed to death near his Binodpur house, a few yards away from the Rajshahi University campus, on December 24 in 2004.
 Inspector Mohammad Helaluddin of the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) pressed charges against eight JMB militants on September 10, 2007.
 In the charge-sheet, Helaluddin claimed that 10 militants took part in the murder. One of them was killed in 2005 and identity of another could never be known.
 The then JMB chief Shayakh Abdur Rahman, who was executed along with five other JMB leaders in March 2007, had ordered Mahub to kill Yunus. Mahub picked the nine others to execute the "operation".
 On January 28, 2010, the then Rajshahi speedy trial tribunal Judge Md Manjurul Bachhid sentenced Mahub and Tarek to death in the case. However, the other charge-sheeted accused were acquitted of the charge.
 Following a petition by the duo challenging their sentences, the High Court later asked the Rajshahi tribunal to hold a retrial, indentifying some "flaws" in the previous trial, said PP Entajul Haque.
 He said the lower court judgement was based on judicial confessions of the two convicts as there were no eyewitnesses in the case.

PRIEST MURDER

Human chains demand arrest, capital punishment of killers

Human chains were formed in Debiganj of Panchagarh and at Thakurgaon intersection yesterday, demanding immediate arrest and capital punishment of the killers of Hindu priest Jogeswar Dasadhikari, 50.
 In Debiganj, students and teachers of Debiganj Degree College joined a human chain in front of their college at noon. Addressing a rally at the venue, the speakers strongly condemned the murder and demanded arrest of the culprits involved. They urged the government to try the killers in a special tribunal.
 College Principal Anisur Rahman, Vice-principal Umapati Roy, and Assistant Prof Nasir Uddin Chowdhury spoke.

After filing of the case, police arrested Babul Hossain, 31, from Dandapal village in the upazila, and Jahangir Hossain, 30, and Khalilur Rahman, from Panchagarh Sadar upazila, suspecting their involvement in the killing.
 Police produced the arrestees before a court on Tuesday that placed them on

a 10-day remand.
