Natore child marriage prevented

A 13-year-old girl was saved from underage marriage following a timely intervention of Natore Sadar upazila administration yesterday.
The victim is Akhi Khatun, 13, a class VI student of Jamhorua Dhakil Madrasa and daughter of Enamul Hossain of the village.
Later, the upazila administration officials took an undertaking from her parents not to marry off their daughters until they turn 18.

BCIC fertiliser workers call off strike

Workers, who were employed in loading of fertiliser sacks onto vehicles in Bangladesh Chemical Industries Corporation (BCIC) in Lalmonirhat Sadar upazila, resumed their work yesterday noon as they withdrew their strike after 30 hours.
Earlier on Thursday, they went on an indefinite strike, demanding payment of their arrears wage of the last 7 months. "We resumed our work with BCIC authorities assuring us of paying our arrears wage and increasing it," said Maminul Islam Babu, president of the workers' union. Workers now get only Tk 18 against loading of 20 sacks of fertiliser onto vehicles.

Man's body recovered in Ctg

Police recovered the body of an unidentified person, aged around 40, from Toll Road area in Chittagong city on Thursday.
Pranab Chowdhury, officer-in-charge of Halishahar police, said, "The man might have been killed after being hit by any unidentified vehicle." Quoting locals, the police official said that the man was psychologically impaired and used to stroll here and there.

One held over Habib murder

Police arrested an accused in a case, filed for killing Kazi Habib, in Sultanpur of Sadar upazila in Moulvibazar early yesterday.
Abdus Salek, officer-in-charge of Moulvibazar Police Station, said Nahid Hasan was held in his residence.
Habib, 22, a BBA 4th year student of Sylhet International University and a Bangladesh Chhatra League activist, was murdered allegedly by his fellows on the campus in the city on January 19.

Dogs vaccinated under AUW campaign

Around 200 stray dogs were vaccinated against six viruses including rabies, rotavirus and influenza in a campaign launched by the students of the Asian University for Women (AUW) in Chittagong city yesterday.
Earlier, the students held a press conference in this regard at a restaurant.
Mandy Indrani Mukhuti, founder president of AUW Animal Welfare Club, said there were around 700 stray dogs in the city. "Taking preventive measure is the best way to combat rabies," she said.

Scanning system at Dhaka airport poor

Says Raslo report published from UK

The UK Department of Transport in a report has expressed concern over the scanning systems of passengers, luggage and cargoes at Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport in the capital, but acknowledged the reasonable protective security measures around it.
The security assessment was undertaken by a UK aviation security expert—the Regional Aviation Security Liaison Officer (Raslo) for Bangladesh—on December 15 last year. In its findings, the report said the airport has failed to meet the required security standards in 75 percent of observations, while succeeded in maintaining that in 25 percent of observations.
It further revealed that the passenger and staff screening process at the terminal was ineffective with the screener not duly focusing on the task, while few bag searches were done during the observation period.
The report said body searches were consistently poor. Similar poor standards of screening of passengers and cabin bags were observed in the gate room's central search area during the period. Staff screening standards at the CIP and VIP access points were also found poor.
However, protective security measures were in place around the airport; hold baggage on transfer to the aircraft as well as inflight supplies (IFS) were effectively screened and protected during the survey time.
In its observation on front house security, it said, "Although bags were all screened, the quality of the screening was unsatisfactory and no bag searches were observed."
About hold baggage security observations, the report mentioned that such baggage was screened by conventional x-ray and supported by the deployment of ETD on the exterior surfaces of bags.
Although ETD was deployed, it was not used particularly effectively, it added.
About supervisory capability and effectiveness, the report said supervision was very ineffective. Managers and CAAB (Civil Aviation Authority, Bangladesh) staff, including the airport director, do walk the patch, but appeared to deal with issues by shouting at staff and there was no coaching and mentoring taking place.
Asked, Md Rashedul Islam Khan, commanding officer of the Airport Armed Police (AAP), said, "AAP is responsible for ensuring the airport security, but passenger and cargo scanning is not our duties."

accessing bribes and delaying services to the public.
"Government officers must provide public services as per the citizens' charters. This is their constitutional duty," said ACC Commissioner Dr Nasiruddin.
No leniency would be tolerated, he added.
"Those who get salaries from the taxes paid by the citizens have no option to show negligence in providing public services," said the commissioner.
He said every three months, a videoconference with the local corruption prevention committee, civil society, and government officials would be held to make the best use of technology in reducing people's harassment in availing public services.

Earlier, they staged a protest rally on the same venue from 3:00pm to 4:25pm. They threatened to go for tougher movements, if their demand for setting the minimum age limit is not met before the 37th BCS exam is advertised.
Later, they brought out a procession blocking the intersection.
The demonstrators said students generally finished university education at the age of 28. As a result, they get only two to three years to prepare for government jobs, they said.
So, it is a very logical and fair demand for raising the age limit, said Mukto Hossain, an agitating student of Dhaka University.
Jahurul Islam, a student of Dhaka College, said they would continue their demonstration until the demand was met.
