India not a big brother

Rather a big 'partner in progress', top BJP leader assures Bangladesh

GOP rivals rip Trump

But promise to support him if he becomes Republican nominee

Donald Trump unleashed fiery, off-colour rhetoric at Thursday's Republican debate after enduring a day of intense criticism by party leaders, as conservatives agonize over embracing his divisive candidacy or derailing his march to the nomination.

But despite escalated attacks against Trump by his rivals on the debate state, each one of them -- Senator Ted Cruz, Senator Marco Rubio, and Ohio Governor John Kasich --

acknowledged they would support the party's eventual nominee.

With the real estate tycoon apparently on a glide path to becoming the Republican standard-bearer, some panic has set in at the prospect of Trump winning the nomination.

Other operatives and voters said it is time, for better or worse, to rally around the man leading the pack.

With the bitter rivals gathered at a pivotal moment in the campaign, the debate attacks SEE PAGE 11 COL 5



Be ready to use nukes N Korea leader tells military; US, Russia call for restraint

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un ordered his country to be ready to use its nuclear weapons at any time and the military to be in "pre-emptive attack" mode in the face of growing threats from its enemies, state media said yesterday.

The comments, carried by the North's official KCNA news agency, marked a further escalation of tension on the Korean peninsula after the UN Security Council imposed harsh new sanctions on the iso-

lated state for its nuclear programme.

North Korea, known for belligerent rhetoric, has previously threatened pre-emptive attacks on its enemies, including South Korea and the United States. Military experts doubt it has yet developed the capability to fire a long-range missile with a miniaturised warhead to deliver a nuclear weapon as far as the United States.

UP member killed in clash over 'teasing' girl


