Good yield, fair prices bring cheer to potato growers

Potato growers in the district are happy to get good yield and fair prices of the item this season.

Now a kg of potato is selling at Tk 9-10 in the field while the production cost was Tk 6-7, farmers said, adding that they got expected yield this year due to favourable weather and good seeds.

"I got 830 maunds (a maund=40 kg) of potato after cultivating it on eight bighas of land spending Tk 1 lakh 50 thousand this season. I have already earned Tk 2 lakh from selling 500 maunds of potato last week," said Jamal Uddin, 50, a farmer of Ambari vil-

lage in Lalmonirhat Sadar. But in last year, he lost Tk one lakh from potato farming as he had to sell it for as low as Tk 5-6.

The filing of cases has drawn condemnation from local and international journalists and journalist unions and human rights bodies.
