Tangail school kids protest 'occupation' of playground

Students of Government Town Primary School in the district headquarters blocked a busy road yesterday protesting construction of a building for Tangail Law College at a portion of the school's playground. Teachers and guardians of the students also took part in the programme to press for their demand to shift the college to another place. The agitation on Victoria Road caused suspension of vehicular movements there and created traffic jam across the town.

The school was established on 41 decimals of land by late Purnendra Mohan Ghosh in 1939 and it was nationalised in 1973, school sources said. Tangail Law College started its academic activities on the school premises in 1982 and later they took lease of 12 decimals of school land. In 1999, a meeting led by the then lawmaker in Tangail Abdul Mannan (late) decided to shift the college to another suitable place but the college authorities did not comply with the decision, school sources said. On Tuesday, with the

support of an influential local leader of Awami League, the college authorities started construction of a concrete structure on the school land, hampering classes of the kids, school-teachers said. "Now around 1200 students are studying at the school and it has reputation for good results. The college should shift as per the previous decision as we have only nine classrooms against the requirement of total 16," said Naiyar Jaha Farzana Zakia, headmistress of the school. Principal of the law college, advocate Khan Mohammad Khaled said the land was leased from the

land ministry following the rules. As the law college authorities could not accommodate all of its 712 students, they recently decided to construct an L-shaped makeshift building on six decimals of land and started the construction work, he said. Contacted, Tangail Deputy Commissioner Mahub Hossain said, "I will arrange a meeting at my conference room over the matter on Monday. Both sides have been asked to place documents in support of their claims. Decision will be given after checking the documents."

Councillor held for 'torturing' orphan

Police arrested a councillor of Jamalpur municipality on charge of torturing a 14-year-old orphan of Jamalpur Shishu Paribar on Wednesday. The arrestee, Jamal Pasha, son of Sohrab Ali of Bania Bazar area under the municipality, is a councillor of Ward No 6. Police said Rakibul Islam Shraban of the orphanage, also a Class VIII student of Bania Bazar High School in Sadar upazila, took part in the annual sports on Wednesday. During the event on the school playground, Shraban locked in an altercation with Shakil Ahmed, 12, nephew of the arrestee, over a trifling matter around 1:30pm, Sabina Yesmin, assistant teacher of the orphanage, said.

Councillor Jamal Pasha, who was present as a special guest, beat up Shraban mercilessly, leaving him critically injured, Sabina said. The boy was taken to the orphanage and later shifted to Jamalpur General Hospital as his condition deteriorated, she added. Jasim Uddin, deputy superintendent of Shishu Paribar, filed a case with Sadar Police Station, accusing Jamal the same night. Police later arrested Jamal and yesterday produced him in a court that sent him to jail.

Four hurt in bomb blast

Four labourers were injured in a bomb blast at Banpara in Jamalpur town yesterday. They are Saidul Islam, 45, Abdur Rahim, 55, Haji Miah, 43, and Rafiqul Islam, 27, of Banpara area of the town. Police and locals said an abandoned bomb exploded when the labourers were digging a pond in the area at around 4:00pm.

Thousands suffer for want of permanent bridge

Over 10,000 people of 10 villages under Kamalapur union of Patuakhali Sadar upazila are suffering because the 300-foot bamboo bridge over Kharijoma canal collapsed during a high tide in March last year. Since then, villagers have been crossing the canal at some risk as their demand for a concrete bridge has not been met. The villagers had built the lone bridge over the canal to connect Kharijoma Bazar at their own initiative two years ago. Students of several educational institutions currently have to cross the canal by boat, which is risky, locals say.

"We are suffering a lot because it is very difficult to go to Kharijoma bazar and the upazila headquarters due to the lack of a bridge," says Abdur Razzak Howlader, a resident of Dharandee village. "We built the bamboo bridge and also repaired it on our own," says Abdus Sobhan, another resident of the same village. During elections all candidates promise to construct a concrete bridge here, but they forget about it after the election, he added. Abul Hasan, a student of Kharijoma Ishaq High School, said "I don't go to school regularly as I have to cross the canal by boat." "More than 300 students of different institutions are suffering a lot due to the lack

of a bridge," said Israt Jahan, headmaster of the school. "The authorities concerned should take immediate steps to relieve people's suffering," said Abdus Salam, local UP chairman. "We sent several letters to the authority concerned for construction of a bridge, but in vain," he added. Abu Saleh Md Hanif, executive engineer of Local Government Engineering Department (LGED) in Patuakhali said they informed the higher authorities about the matter. Md. Tariquzzaman Moni, chairman of Patuakhali Sadar upazila, said, "We will send a letter asking the LGED to take steps as soon as possible."

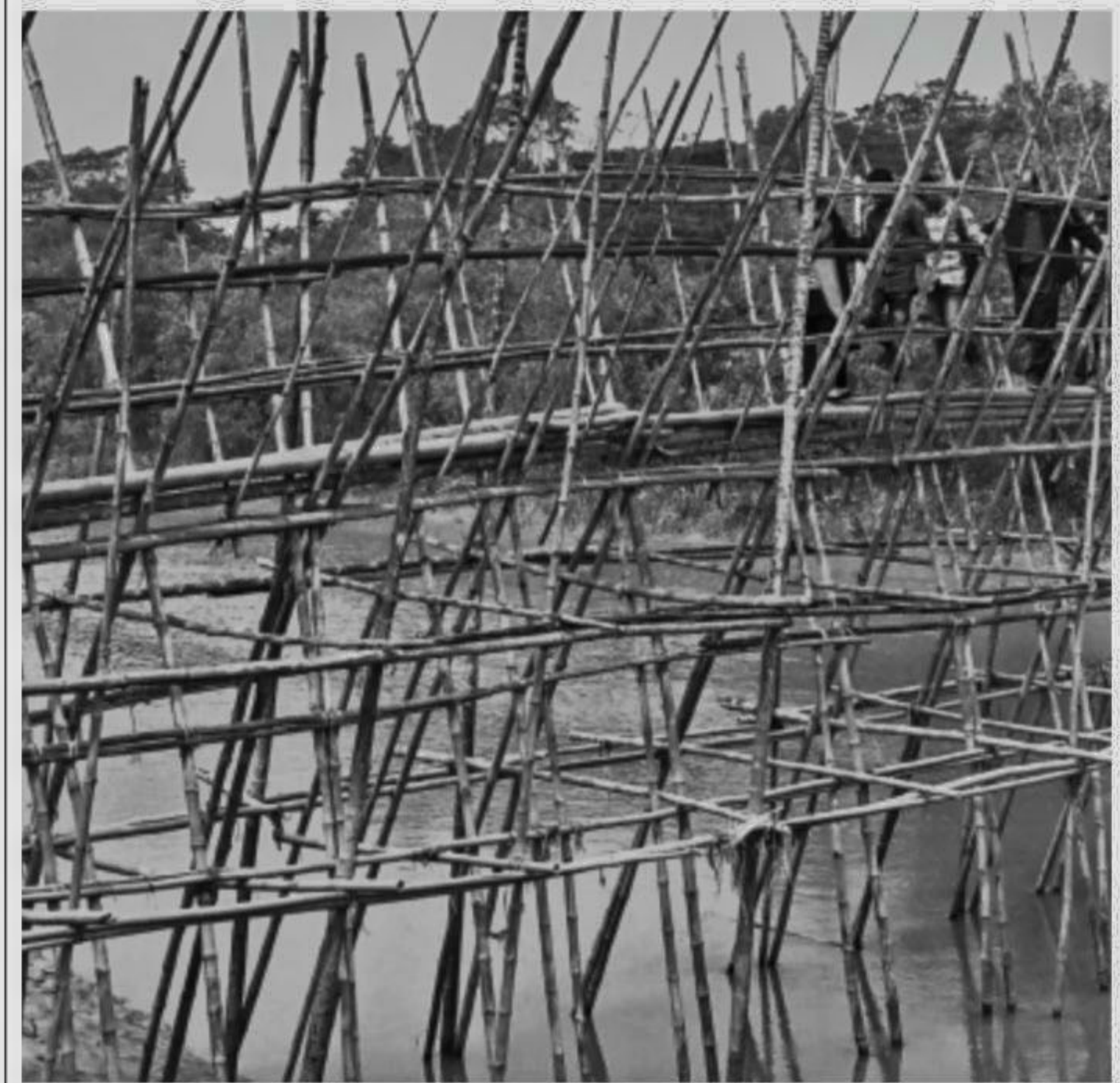


