Reckless driving again kills 3 kids

Just day after killing 2 CITY DESK

Reckless driving again claimed the lives of three more kids including two of a family in two districts yesterday, a day after two others were killed in road accidents.

In Chittagong, two kids and their mother were killed while their father was injured in a head-on collision between a pickup van and a CNG-run auto-rickshaw carrying them on Muhuri Project road in Tita Battol area of Mirsarai upazila.

The deceased were Saheda Begum, 32, and her two sons Saimon, 10, and eight-monthold Saidul Islam. Saheda's husband Md Didar sustained minor injuries, said Sub-inspector of Jorarganj Police Station Mainuddin.

Didar along with his wife and three kids was going to their village in Imampur of the upazila from Dhaka. Didar's daughter, however, was unhurt, said police. In Dinajpur, seven-year-old

Armina, daughter of Arman Ali of Buniadpur village, was killed as a motorcycle hit her near Buniadpur Bazar in Biral upazila. A class I student of

PM urges wealthy citizens UNB, Dhaka

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday called upon the well-off section of society and business organisations to donate buses to educational institutions to help reduce pressure of private cars on city streets.

"The more and more use of buses by students will help reduce the pressure of private vehicles on the streets and it will ultimately help ease traffic jams both in the capital and other cities of the country," she said.

Hasina said this while handing over keys of seven buses to the authorities of Birshreshtha Noor Mohammad Public College and Birshreshtha Munshi Abdur Rouf Public College at Pilkhana in the capital.

Nitol-Niloy Group donated the 35-seat buses. Four were given to Birshreshtha Noor Mohammad Public College and three to Birshreshtha Munshi Abdur Rouf Public College.

Ctg cop accused of torture, extortion

He denies allegations

Police allegedly assaulted a jewellery trader and later released him in exchange for money in Mirsarai of Chittagong on Saturday night.

Horekrisna Mridha, owner of Rupa House of Rajor in Madaripur, was returning to his Madaripur residence by a bus from a Chittagong ornament market after securing order for making some jewellery.

A team of Mirsarai Police Station led by Sub-inspector Md Waliullah stopped the vehicle in the area for a search, said Mridha.

The SI got him out of the bus, found some silver in his bag, and said those were illegal, said the trader.

The police official threatened to implicate him in a case and started beating him although he said he had all documents and a trade licence, said Mridha.

"The SI later took Tk 10,000 from me and released me after taking my signature on a blank paper," he said.

Contacted, SI Waliullah said the trader had no legal documents of the silver at that time.

Denying the allegation of torture and extortion, the SI said the trader raised a false allegation against him.

They released him after taking his signature and mobile number on a blank paper so that they could contact him further, if necessary, he said, adding that it was their regular practice.

No allegation was lodged with the police station in this connection, said Officer-in-Charge Imtiaz Bhuiyan.

"But we will look into the matter and take action if any-

body is found guilty," said the OC. Salauddin Sikder, assistant superintendent of police of

Mirsarai circle, said he was not aware of the incident. Mridha said he did not seek legal recourse thinking that he would not get justice.

Zero tolerance ordered for violence, foul play

Claims Election Commission

The Election Commission has directed law enforcers and the civil administration to show zero tolerance to irregularities and violence ahead of the union parishad polls, an official claimed yesterday.

Election Commissioner Shah Nawaz said, "We have found allegations of violence in some places. We have asked them not to spare anyone if they commit violence and irregularity."

"We will not hesitate to take action against any person, whoever he or she is, if the person violates the electoral code," he told reporters at his office at the EC Secretariat.

Action will be taken against police, local administration and polling officials if they are found guilty of negligence in discharging duties, he added.

The commissioner also sought cooperation from all stakeholders including political parties, police, administration, candidates, and supporters for free and fair voting.

Election to 732 union parishads will be held on March 22 in the first phase and 650 UPs on March 31 in the second phase. More than 2,800 UPs will go to polls in four other phases until June.

With the election day drawing closer,

there have been reports of violence in different districts as supporters of candidates are engaging in clashes.

BNP alleged that the party workers were being attacked and harassed by Awami League's activists in many places, but the EC was not taking any action. On the other hand, the AL alleged that

the EC in some cases had illogically enforced laws only on AL men without proper investigation to prove that it was a neutral organisation. When his attention was drawn about

allegations of the two parties, Shah Nawaz said, "We are concentrating on holding the elections in a fair manner, not on whether any political party is dissatisfied or not." Our Faridpur correspondent reports, a
