

Ordeal of an AIDS patient

Sultana (not the real name) was shocked when refused a surgery on an abscess at a public hospital in Dhaka sometime in 2013 because of being HIV positive.

The doctor left the operating room when she informed him of having been infected by human immunodeficiency virus. "His [doctor's] face changed immediately. Furious, he asked me how I got the disease, insinuating that I was a bad

The 30-year-old was then asked to go to a private hospital. She instead went to another public hospital, Shaheed Suhrawardy Medical College Hospital. This time, she chose to hide her illness to get the operation done.

This is not the first time she was secretive about her health. Only a few of her parents' and in-laws' family members know that she has AIDS (acquired immune deficiency syndrome), a disease so rare in Bangladesh that less than 0.1 percent of the population have contracted it, according to the annual progress report of Bangladesh 2015 on HIV/AIDS.

"On my mothers' side, none but my mother knows about it. This is because they would have a bad idea about me [if they were told this], "Sultana said on March 10.

CLASH BETWEEN VILLAGERS, HEZBUT TAWHEED MEN

3 killed in Noakhali

Two alleged members of Hezbut Tawheed, an Islamist group, and a local were killed and over 150 others, including several policemen, injured in a clash between villagers and the Hezbut men over building a mosque for the Islamist group in Sonaimuri upazila yesterday.

The Hezbut activists are Ibrahim Khan Rubel, 27, son of Nurul Haque, and Mohammad Solaiman, 24, of Pourkara village, and local Mujibul Haque Mujib, 50, of Khodkhasta village.

were found on the bodies of the two other deceased, said police.

Elias Sharif, superintendent of police in Noakhali, said there had been a longstanding conflict between the Hezbut members

and the villagers of Pourkara as they believed that the Hezbut men, followers of its founder Bayezid Khan Panni, was "propagating against Islam".

On 24 February, the Hezbut men held a public meeting near Chashirhat Union Parishad and made some "derogatory comments about Islam", which angered the villagers, said police.

Around 11:00am yesterday, when the Hezbut activists had gathered Pourkara to resume the construction work of the mosque, which was abandoned several years ago following protests by locals, the villagers Mujib was shot dead, while marks of stab rushed to the spot and asked them to stop their work. This triggered an altercation between the Hezbut men and the locals.

At one stage, locals, equipped with rods and sticks, swooped on the Hezbut men and

3 lakh yaba pills seized; 7 held

A team of Rapid Action Battalion-7 recovered three lakh yaba tablets worth about Tk 12 crore from a finishing trawler in the Bay of Bengal yesterday afternoon.

It also rounded up seven people in connection with the incident and seized the trawler, MV Rafsan.

The arrestees are Md Alam, 42, Nasir Uddin, 44, Md Kalim Ullah, 24, Md Asraf Uddin, 16, Md Hossain, 25, Md Jasim, 22, and Md Kamal, 26.

Acting on information that a huge amount of yaba tablets would be brought to Cox's Bazar by a fishing trawler, the Rab team led by Lt Col Miftah Uddin Ahmed, commanding officer of Rab-7, conducted a drive in the sea, arrested the seven and recovered the contraband drug stuffed in the cold storage of the vessel, said Syed Mohsinul Haque, squad commander of Rab-7 Cox's Bazar camp.

Law enforcers were quizzing the arrestees to identify the kingpin of the gang.

3 high officials from US due this month



Putin orders pull-out of Russian forces

Russian President Vladimir Putin has ordered the defence ministry to begin the withdrawal of Russian forces from Syria from today.

"The task that was set before our defence ministry and armed forces has as a whole been completed and so I order the defence ministry to from tomorrow start the withdrawal of the main part of our military contingents from the Syrian Arab Republic," Putin told Defence Minister Sergei Shoigu in televised comments yesterday.

The Kremlin announced that Putin had called President Bashar al-Assad to inform Moscow's long-standing ally of the surprise move that appears to end the main part of its intervention in Syria's conflict that began in September.

"The leaders noted that the actions of the Russian airforce allowed to radically change the situation in the fight against terrorism, to disorganise the fighters' infrastructure and inflict significant damage on them," the Kremlin said in a statement.

"Taking that into account, the President of Russia stated that the main tasks set before the armed forces of Russia in Syria had been completed. It was agreed to carry out the withdrawal of the main part of Russia's airforce contingent," the statement said.

Turkey pounds PKK camps Erdogan vows to bring terror 'to its

knees' as death toll climbs to 36 AGENCIES

Turkey yesterday held four suspects over a suicide car bombing that killed at least 36 people in Ankara, as warplanes pounded Kurdish rebel bases in northern Iraq over the attack, the capital's third in five months. There was no immediate claim of responsibility for the

latest carnage, which reduced cars and buses to charred husks on a busy road in the heart of the city on Sunday evening, wounding more than 120 people. But Ankara believes one of the bombers was a woman

Racism, not Islam, incites confrontation

Says anti-Trump protester

The protester who disrupted a Donald Trump rally in Ohio over the weekend wanted to send a message against racism and "violent, white supremacist ideas," he said in an interview airing yesterday.

Thomas DiMassimo caused a stir Saturday when he tried to rush the stage in Dayton, where the Republican presidential frontrunner was wrapping up a campaign speech.

"I was thinking that Donald Trump is a bully, and he is nothing more than that," the 22-year old college student told CNN.

"He is somebody who is just saying a lot of bold things, he's making bold claims. But I can see right through that and I can see that he's truly just a coward. And he's opportunistic and he's willing to destroy this country for power for himself," DiMassimo said.

DiMassimo was prevented from reaching Trump by the billionaire businessman's security detail and US Secret Service officers who quickly



Farmer builds Aztec pyramid in Mexico

Raymundo Corona, a farmer from Mexico, has gone and built a 22-foot Aztec pyramid in the desert, 74 km from the Mexico-US border.

When people asked him why he went through the trouble of building a pyramid in the desert, he said he was simply following the instructions of an alien who paid him a visit three decades ago.

Speaking to a local newspaper, Corona described the alien as a tall man with honey-coloured eyes and white hair, by the name of Herulayka. He apparently came from a planet called Nefilin, which
